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



rofessor Friday Okonofua, MD, PhD, ad eundem FRCOG, is a medical doctor and a professor of obstetrics and gynecology at the University of Benin for many years. He is a fellow of the West African College of Surgeons, the Nigerian Postgraduate Medical College, the International College of Surgeons, the International Health program at Harvard University, and the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. He also has PhD in International Health from the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm, Sweden. He is a Fellow of both the Nigerian Academy of Science (FAS) as well as the New York Academy of Science.

Okonofua commenced his academic career as Lecturer 1 in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Obafemi Awolowo University in 1986. He served as the Acting Head of Department between 1987 and 1992, and rose to the post of Professor in 1992. He transferred his services to the University of Benin in 1996, where he had been the Head of Department, Dean, Provost, and member of the University's Governing Council.

He has also been Secretary of the Faculty of Obstetrics and Gynecology of the National Postgraduate College of Nigeria, as well as the Secretary-General of the Society of Gynecology and Obstetrics of Nigeria. Between April 2005 and November 2009, he served as the Executive Director of the International Federation of Gynecology and Obstetrics (FIGO), supervising projects management in the 110 member countries of the organization. He was also a Honorary Adviser on Health to President Olusegun Obasanjo from July 2006 to May 29, 2007.

Professor Okonofua is a champion of women's health, a discipline where he has published more than 200 refereed articles.

He is a recipient of more than 40 research grants, and he is a member of several international organizations and committees, including the editorial board of the British Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology, where he has served for more than 12 years. He has attended and presented scientific papers in 100 conferences in up to 40 countries around the world. He is a reviewer to 20 international journals, and a technical consultant to many international agencies, including the World Health Organisation, the Macarthur Foundation and the Ford Foundation.

He is a recipient of several honors, including the Distinguished Alumnus Award of the Obafemi Awolowo University, Special Achievers Award by the Nigerian Television Authority, Distinguished Services Award by the Society of Gynecology and Obstetrics of Nigeria, Award of "the most outstanding professor of the people" by the Students Union Government of the University of Benin.

He was also recently honoured by the VC of UNIBEN for contributions to the success of the university where he served in many capacities for many years before he was appointed the pioneer VC of UNIMED by Governor Olusegun Mimiko.

Okonofua was also on December 2, 2016 honoured with the chieftaincy title of Gbekoleke of Ondo Kingdom by the Osemawe of Ondo Kingdom, Oba (Dr) Victor Kiladejo.

he Emeritus Professor Oladipupo Akinkugbe, CFR, MD, D.Phil, FRCP, FWACP, FAS, NNOM, Officier de l'Ordre National de la Republique de Cote d'Ivoire, is a multiple award-winning and one of the most respected and distinguished academic physicians in Nigeria.

He is Emeritus Professor of Medicine at the College of Medicine, University of Ibadan. He has served on several international bodies and he is a member of the World Health Organisation Technical Advisory Committee on Health Research as well as an Honorary Fellow of Balliol College, Oxford.

Born in Ondo on July 17, 1933, he attended Government College Ibadan (1946-51), University College Ibadan (now University of Ibadan) (1951-55), University of London (1955-58), University of Liverpool (1960), and Oxford University (1962-64). He became Professor of Medicine, University of Ibadan (1968); Dean of Medicine (1970-74); Visiting Professor of Medicine at Harvard (1974-75); Oxford (1981-82) and Cape Town (1995); Principal, then Vice Chancellor, University of Ilorin (1975-78); Vice Chancellor, Ahmadu Bello University (1978-79); Pro-Chancellor, University of Port Harcourt (1986-90); Foundation Chair, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and Chairman, Management Board, University College Hospital, Ibadan (2000-2003).

He is a member of various international medical and scientific panels, and author of many papers on hypertension and renal diseases in national and international journals. In 1989 he received the Searle Distinguished Research Award for his contributions to hypertension in black populations; and in 2004 he received the Boehringer Ingelheim Award of the International Society of Hypertension. He was made Honorary Fellow of Balliol College, Oxford University in 2009 and has Honorary Doctorate from six Nigerian universities, including his alma mater, the University of Ibadan. He has also been conferred with traditional chieftaincy titles from Ile-Ife, Ondo, Ibadan and Ijebu-Igbo.

He is married to Professor Folasade Akinkugbe (nee Dina) and they have two sons and a set of grand-twins.

Professor Tolu Odugbemi hails from Oke-Igbo in Ile-Oluji/Okeigbo Local Government of Ondo State, Nigeria. After a brilliant primary and secondary school education, he enrolled in the College of Medicine of the University of Lagos to read Medicine during which he also registered as a Pioneer Student of Microbiology. He emerged with a B.Sc. (Hons) degree Microbiology in 1970 and the MBBS Degree in 1972. He also obtained a Diploma in Bacteriology from the University of Toronto, Canada (1976) as well as Doctor of Philosophy Degree (Ph.D) University of Sheffield (1978) and Doctor of Medicine (M.D) Degree in 1982 from the University of Lagos (UNILAG). He completed his residency training in Medical Microbiology at the Lagos University Teaching Hospital, Idi-Araba and subsequently qualified as a Fellow of the West African College of Physicians (FWACP) in 1976. He is also a Foundation fellow of the National Postgraduate Medical College (FMCPath) and a Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists, U.K (FRCPath).

He was the foundation Professor and Head of the Department of Medical Microbiology and Parasitology, Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Ilorin from 1983-1985, Professor and Head Department of Microbiology and Parasitology, College of Medicine of the University of Lagos at various times. Honorary Lecturer, Department of Medical Microbiology, University of Sheffield, UK, 1976-1978, Guest Researcher, Centers for Disease Control (CDC), Sexually Transmitted Diseases, Research Laboratory, Center for Infectious Diseases, Atlanta, Georgia, USA, 1981-1982. He is also a former Honorary Consultant Microbiologist, Lagos University Teaching Hospital and the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital.

Professor Tolu Odugbemi, is a researcher who has made many land mark contributions to medical profession and humanity through his outstanding research findings. He has to his credit over 200 publications in National and International Journals and Articles of excellent research in Microbiology and other areas. He has also played a key role in dissemination of medical research findings by founding the Nigeria Journal of Health and Biomedical Sciences. He had previously served as Editor-in-Chief of the Nigerian Quarterly Journal of Hospital Medicine and as Editorial consultant to other medical journals and member of several professional bodies.

A seasoned administrator, he served as Provost, College of Medicine of the University of Lagos (CMUL) 1997-2000, President National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria (2002-2003). He is a former Vice-Chancellor of the University of Lagos (2007-2010) and also the Ondo State University of Science and Technology (OSUSTECH) Okitipupa, Nigeria (2010-2015). Prof Odugbemi has previously served on the governing councils of the University of Lagos, Ondo State University of Science and Technology, West African College of Physicians, Nigerian Academy of Science and the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria. As President of the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria he was also the Chairman of the Governing Board of that institution.

Prof. Odugbemi has received many accolades nationally and internationally for his distinguished scholarship and outstanding contributions to the field of medicine and uplift of Education. He was honoured with the Nigerian National Order of Merit (NNOM) and the Officer of the Order of Niger (OON) awards on 6th December, 2007 and 14th February, 2008 respectively by the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria. He is a Fellow of the Nigeria Academy of Science, a Distinguished Fellow of the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria (DFMC) and a recipient of an honorary Doctor of Science (Hon. D.Sc) degree from his alma mater, The University of Sheffield, United Kingdom. He also holds the traditional chieftaincy titles of Alatunse of Okeigbo, Gbekoniyi of Ondo Kingdom and Fiwajoye of Oke-Ayedun Ekiti .

Professor Fola Esan graduated with an MB BS with honours from the University College, Ibadan (University of London) in 1962 gaining distinctions in Pathology and Obstetrics and Gynaecology. After postgraduate training in Ibadan, Nigeria, London, UK, and in the USA (New York and San Francisco), he was appointed Professor of Haematology in Ibadan in 1975, a position from which he voluntarily retired in 1988. He served as the Director (re-designated Director-General) at the National Institute for Medical Research, Yaba, Lagos, 1986-88. He then worked in academic institutions in the Middle East (Saudi Arabia and UAE) and returned home to set up (with Professor G. B. Ogunmola, a retired professor of chemistry) the Institute of Genetic Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine in Ibadan.

Professor Esan was appointed Provost, College of Medicine, Ekiti State University between April 2009 and July 2013 with a remit to resuscitate the suspended College where he was employed as a Professor. His area of specialization in Haematology is the haemoglobinopathies and thalassaemia for which he received grants and awards including the Langley Memorial Prize of the London School for Tropical Medicine and Hygiene in 1974. He was the Foundation Secretary of the Nigerian Society for Haematology and Blood Transfusion and later served two terms as President. He was elected Fellow of the Nigerian Academy of Science in 1982 and have served in various capacities including Editor of The Proceedings, member of Council, Lead Person for the Forum on Evidence-based Health Policy Making, Chairman, Health Sciences Committee and IAMP Contact Person and member of the IAMP Executive Committee.

He was very instrumental in shaping the faculty of pathology of the National postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria. He held several important positions in the Nigeria Medical Association and has significant research contributions on the Clinical, biochemical and molecular studies on abnormal hemoglobin's especially sickle cell anemia.

He is currently a Director at Institute of Genetic Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine.

igh Chief Johnson Olusola Adeduro was born in Ondo to Late High Chief Samuel Adeduro, the Adaja of Ondo and Madam Comfort Olakunbi Adeduro (nee Famutimi, the Late Aruwa of Ondo) on December 2, 1942.

He started his primary education at St. Matthew's School, Owena and finished at St. John's Primary School, Ondo in 1958, thereafter he attended Jubilee Modern School the following year and graduated in 1961. In 1962 he proceeded to Ondo Boys' High School (O.B.H.S.) and passed out in 1965. He proceeded to United States of America in 1969 and enrolled at Howard University, Washington D. C. and graduated with flying colours with a Bachelor of Science, Chemistry in 1973.

He finally came back to the country in 1976 and took up an appointment with the defunct Food and Drug Administration Department of the Federal Ministry of Health (now NAFDAC. After exactly 10years of meritorious service, he withdrew his service from the Federal Ministry of Health.

High Chief Adeduro formed a corporate organization called JOLUS LIMITED. The company had been growing from strength to strength. He is also the Chairman (CEO) of Sofuros Nig. Ltd. (A Real Estate Company) and a Director of defunct Trust Bank of Africa where he served as Chairman of several committees of the Board. He is also the Chairman of Transatlantic Property Management Company Limited.

He is a member of some social organisations among which is Club 11 of Nigeria (Former President) which he founded with close friends, Chairman of Landlord Association of Rumudaolu Market Road, Port Harcourt. He is a Patron of some Social Organisations among which are Ondo Youth Association (OYA) and The Great Mercury Club of Africa. He is devout Christian and a member of Brotherly love Circle of St Stephen's Cathedral Church, Ondo.

For his outstanding performance in all facets of life, High Chief Adeduro has received several awards. Some of the awards are; a merit award by The Diocese of Anglican Communion at the year 2005 Synod; a merit award as Chief Launcher of Ekimogun Day 2005; a merit award from Ondo Development Committee on Ekimogun Day 2007. Others include a merit Award on 90 years founder's Day Celebration of Ondo Boys' High School, Ondo; a Distinguished Award at the 2011 Edition of High Chief Olabanji Akingbule Public Lecture and Awards; Award of Excellence from Rotary International.

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE UNIVERSITY

n December 8, 2014, the Executive Governor of Ondo State, His Excellency, Dr. Olusegun Mimiko, signed the Ondo State University of Medical Sciences Law 2014. In March 2015, Mr Governor approved the appointment of the first Vice-Chancellor, Professor Friday Okonofua, FAS and the first Registrar, Dr. (Mrs) Eunice Funke Oyebade, mni. The existing "Medical Village", comprising the Mother and Child Hospital, Trauma Centre, the Kidney Care Centre and the Gani Fawehinmi Diagnostic Centre, was to be integrated into the University and formed its take-off administrative and resource base. The surrounding 100 hectares of land was acquired by the government to allow future expansion of the University.

At the time of the appointment of the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar, not much physical, infrastructural, academic and administrative planning had taken place and the National Universities Commission (NUC) had therefore not been approached for formal recognition of the University. With the instrument establishing the University by the Ondo State Government, the new University therefore approached the NUC for official recognition, which was given on April 22, 2015.

In presenting the letter of recognition to the Executive Governor, Dr Olusegun Mimiko, the Executive Secretary of the NUC said inter alia: "I wish to congratulate the Government and people of Ondo State for this establishment of the Ondo State University of Medical Sciences. With effect from 22nd April, 2015, the Ondo State University of Medical Sciences has been recognised by the National Universities Commission as the 40th State University and the 139th University in Nigeria. It is however advised that the University should invite the NUC to assess the resources and facilities before the enrolment of students into the medical programmes".

Despite the recognition given by the NUC, the University could not begin official administrative work until July 2015, due to resource and funding constraints. It was only then that some staff were appointed and the framework for administrative duties was established.

The Governing Council of the university under the able chairmanship of Emeritus Professor Oladipupo Akinkugbe, FAS, CFR was inaugurated by Governor Olusegun Mimiko on November 16, 2015 thus signalling the readiness of the university to commence academic activities.

On December 7, 2015, an advisory team of the National Universities Commission visited the university, apparently to appraise its readiness to commence academic activities. The NUC visit was followed shortly after on December 9 by the team of the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria. The two regulatory bodies were satisfied by their findings even as they dropped hints of areas in which they expected further efforts. The MDCN later wrote to the UNIMED VC that it was impressed by what the university had on ground. In the letter, the MDCN Registrar, Dr. A.A. Ibrahim, said, "Following the advisory visitation to your university on Wednesday, December 9, 2015 by a team from the MDCN that inspected your facilities, personnel and curriculum of study, I write to convey Council's satisfaction with the ongoing efforts at properly establishing your medical school."

Barely one month after the NUC and MDCN visits, the University on January 5, 2016 released its first admission list while its pioneer students started arriving at their hall of residence on January 10, 2016. There is no stopping UNIMED from then on as various activities, including registration of students, orientation and commencement of

classes were accomplished in record time. A total of 192 pioneers students, spread across five programmes-Medicine, Dentistry, Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry-were matriculated on March 5, 2016. The University was also formally inaugurated by Governor Olusegun Mimiko on the same day.

Within its short life, the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo, has established itself as a stakeholder to reckon with in the health and education sectors. On June 15, 2016 the university held its First Distinguished Lecture, drawing to the campus top academics, distinguished medical practitioners and other stakeholders to listen to the Guest Lecturer, Emeritus Professor Kelsey Harrison, a former VC of the University of Port Harcourt.

On July 7, 2016, the university similarly attracted top government functionaries, academics, royal fathers, captains of industries and other citizens to the epoch-making launching of the Friends of UNIMED Fund (FUF). The scheme, FUF, is a novel effort by the university's managers to create a pool of friends who will contribute to the funding of the university. In its bare form, the FUF aims at raising one million friends who are expected to contribute at least One Thousand Naira annually to fund the university. The scheme has continued to excite Nigerians as well as attract donors who are eager to contribute far more than the minimum. And more than cash, UNIMED friends have contributed other items, including office equipments and other facilities. The biggest donor to the scheme so far is Chief Isaac Akintade, the Saibi Gogou of Ondo Kingdom, who has commenced construction of the multi-million naira Faculty of Basic Clinical Sciences building he pledged under the FUF.

ADDRESSING THE OBJECTIVES OF THE UNIVERSITY

The specific objectives for establishing UNIMED are as follows:

- ? To prepare students for leading professional roles in all disciplines in the health sector in Nigeria and globally;
- ? To offer the best tertiary health care (including preventive and curative care) for all forms of diseases, disabilities and deformities that are prevalent in Nigeria specifically, and throughout the African region broadly:
- ? To promote research and creative work for transforming and improving the health of Nigerians and the world at large;
- ? To develop human and physical resources of the University to some of the best attainable standards in the world; and
- ? To promote the health and social well-being of Nigerians through engagement, outreach services and public education.

VICE-CHANCELLOR'S SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

GOAL: The goal of the foundation Vice-Chancellor of UNIMED is to position the University to support Nigeria's quest for high quality education, service delivery, research and innovation in the health sciences.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES: This goal would be attained through the following strategic objectives:

- 1) Build a transparent, effective and accountable governance that will establish the University on sound administrative and academic principles similar to those found in the best University traditions anywhere in the world;
- 2) Develop a multi-stakeholder funding base, and engender the sensible and accountable appropriation and use of the funds for the sustainable development of the University, especially to promote infrastructural and staff development and boost teaching, clinical services and research activities;
- 3) Provide for the systematic infrastructural development of the University using the highest standards and models of architecture and physical planning for campus development;
- 4) Promote the academic growth of the University by ensuring full accreditation of all its academic courses within the shortest possible period of time, and increasing academic and research outputs, with increased ranking of the University, overall; and
- 5) Support community out-reach services such that the University will immediately begin to address the socio-economic development and health problems of its immediate communities and be the lead institutional advisor on the developmental aspirations of the local community.



STRATEGIES FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES

The following strategies for achieving the specific objectives were identified in the foundational years of the institution:

- ? Development of the UNIMED Strategic Plan
- ? Effective and accountable governance
- ? Fund-raising for sustainable funding
- ? Transparent budget, financial and audit procedures
- ? Infrastructural development
- ? Cutting-edge academic development
- ? Contributions to community development

DEVELOPMENT OF THE UNIMED STRATEGIC PLAN

The goal of UNIMED is to become a world-class university while delivering excellence and innovation in health education and research for the improvement of health in communities with high burden of diseases and to curb medical tourism. As part of efforts to achieve excellence and drive the vision and mission of the University, the development of a strategic plan was accorded top priority by the Management. To that extent, machineries were set in motion to develop a comprehensive plan with the appointment of a Consultant in the person of Prof. Peter Okebukola to facilitate the process leading to the preparation of the strategic plan document. Three workshops (funded by the Ford Foundation) were held between 2016 with all University administrators, faculty and staff in attendance to draw up the 5-year University strategic plan spanning the period between 2016 and 2020. This approach was employed to provide an opportunity for maximum input by all, provide a framework and a clearly defined direction for the University, increase the level of commitment to the organization and its goals, and buy-in by all to increase compliance.







EFFECTIVE AND ACCOUNTABLE GOVERNANCE

From inception, the University has put in place core principles of corporate governance that include best practices, accountability, transparency, efficiency and effective service delivery, effective use of committee system, institutional checks and balances, principle of trust and consensus, staff motivation and welfare as well as the concept of community services to the society.

ADMINISTRATIVE SETUP

With the appointment of the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar and inauguration of the Governing Council on Monday, 16th November 2015 by His Excellency and Visitor to the University, Dr. Olusegun Mimiko, CON, other



organs of the University like the Senate, Congregation as well as other statutory committees were put in place for effective administration and governance of the new University.

RETREATS, ADMINISTRATIVE TRAININGS AND WORKSHOPS

As part of efforts to foster excellence in teaching, research and service delivery in all health sciences disciplines, the University decided on the option of doing things differently in ways to correct the present inadequacies that bedevil the tertiary educational system in Nigeria. One of the strategies that the University has identified for achieving its developmental milestones is unrelenting staff training, re-orientation and staff motivation.

In achieving the above, the University convened a unique staff orientation workshop for its pioneer Academic and Non-teaching staff between Monday 1st and Friday 5th February, 2016 in order to build common understanding of the specific methods to be adopted for growing the University to world class status. The workshop brought together some of the best minds in University education.

The one-week training was funded by the Ford Foundation and facilitated by eminent and distinguished academics. The facilitators included:

Apart from the retreat/capacity building workshop for staff, the University has also put in place a Short Course/Training Committee to plan and organize short term courses and training programmes in the University. To date, the Committee has successfully organized three (3) training programmes with participants drawn from different tertiary institutions across the country and from the Gambia. These training programmes are titled; Reducing Maternal Mortality in West and Central Africa, Basic Life Support (BLS) Training Programme and Short Course on Grant Proposal Writing and Financial Management in Tertiary Institutions.













STAFF DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING

As part of the University's policy of improving the capacity of its staff, the Management has continued to support staff to acquire additional qualifications in order to enhance their effectiveness and efficiency on the job. In that regard, approval had been granted to two (2) academic staff to further their studies abroad and one (1) non-teaching staff to pursue Post graduate Diploma Certificate. In addition, the University has continued to encourage and support staff to attend local and international administrative and scientific conferences.

COMMITTEE SYSTEM OF GOVERNANCE

To give credence to and fast track the decision making process, the University Management has adopted the committee system of governance in all spheres of its administration. Apart from the statutory Council and Senate committees, there are also various administrative and ad-hoc committees, which have been constituted to ensure the participation of all stakeholders in the decision-making process. These committees meet periodically or as occasions demand and make recommendations to the University Management on issues referred to them.

STAFF WELFARE

The University has continued to make staff welfare its priority despite the meager resources available to it. Substantial progress has however, been made in the following areas:

- i. Contributory Pension Scheme
- ii. Establishment of a Co-operative Society to assist staff to meet their financial and material need
- iii. Approval of salary advance/Loans
- iv. Training and development through conferences, in-house seminars and higher academic pursuit.

THE UNIVERSITY REGISTRY

The University Registry is headed by a consummate and seasoned university administrator, Dr. (Mrs.) E. F. Oyebade, mni. The Registry provides the needed support to the academic organs for the sustenance of the young University. As at November, 2016, the University has a total number of 145 staff (Academic Staff 48, Senior Administrative and Technical Staff 62 and 37 Junior Staff).

DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF GUIDELINES, PROCEDURES AND ADMINISTRATIVE MANUALS

The Registry has taken the initiative of developing appropriate guidelines and procedures to guide the operations of the University. The Standing Orders of Council and Senate had been developed and adopted for use by the two statutory bodies for the conduct of their businesses. Administrative manuals such as the Conditions of Service for Junior and Senior Staff, Scheme of Service for Senior and Junior Staff, Schedule of Duties for Staff, Registry Manual, Students' Handbook of Information, Security and Safety Manual, Financial Regulations Manual, etc. had been developed and approved by the Governing Council for the use of the University.

PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

A practical measurement and evaluation procedure has been put in place to measure the performance of the various departments and units. Such performance evaluation mechanisms include: the periodic review of activities of departments/units to assess the impact and progress made so far, the use of lecturers' evaluation forms and staff appraisal forms.



ICT DEVELOPMENT

The Information and Communication Technology Centre has the mandate to develop and maintain an ICT roadmap for the University to achieve effective internal governance and global excellence. It is saddled with the responsibility of ensuring an IT-driven environment based on modern technology. It is a central service unit that provides IT facilities for teaching, research and consultancy services within the university and to the outside world.

DEVELOPMENT OF 5 -YEAR ICT PLAN

In order to properly guide the unit, a 5-year (i.e. 2016 2020) plan with the following goals was drawn:

To create visibility of UNIMED among Nigerian Universities by 2017; ensure that all buildings and facilities in UNIMED are fully connected to the Internet by 2018; provide E-Learning Management System platform for teaching and research by 2018; deploy Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) solutions for University transactions by 2019; to provide IT competencies for staff, students and host community by 2017; ensure that UNIMED is provided with state of art ICT Centre 2018; ensure provision of communication and security infrastructure 2017; recruit and train 10 personnel in different areas of IT to meet the University IT requirements.

MANAGEMENT OF INTERNET SERVICES

The University currently subscribes to the Nigerian Research and Education Network (NgREN) Infrastructure for internet access provision.

WEBSITE AND PORTAL DEVELOPMENT

In the year under review, the University hosted a University website (www.unimedondo.edu.ng). The website was populated with relevant contents from the various faculties, departments and units of the University.

NETWORKING OF UNITS AND DEPARTMENTS

The administrative building, Bursary department and the Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences was equipped with both wire and wireless Local Area Network.

USER SUPPORT SERVICES

The ICT Unit also offers user support services and training for students and staff.



DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF FUND-RAISING STRATEGIC PLAN

Universities, globally, have multiple sources of funding. The University of Medical Sciences, Ondo primarily receives funds from the State Government; however, the national economic recession and the dwindling government resources has made it difficult to depend on government funding alone for developing the university. Consequently, it became expedient for the University to develop and implement different fund-raising strategies to facilitate its infrastructural growth and development.

The University's fund-raising objective is to generate funds to finance the University's development projects in a short period of time. The University aims to internally generate at least 25% of UNIMED budgetary needs by the year 2018.

ACTIVITIES TO ATTAIN THE OBJECTIVES

As a result of the need to increase the University's funding sources, the Governing Council at its meeting held on February 18, 2016, decided to establish the Friends of UNIMED FUND (FUF) and Friends of UNIMED Network (FUN) for the purpose of obtaining the resources to grow the University to attain its mission and vision statements within a short period of time. The objectives of the UNIMED FUF are twofold: 1) to build a multitude of friends for the University who will see themselves as joint owners, and therefore be willing to make regular contributions towards the development of the University; and 2) to manage the Fund in a transparent, effective and accountable manner for specific identifiable projects on research, service delivery and development of the University.

The idea is to generate a cohort of friends for the university who will make regular, small and determined financial contributions towards the implementation of specific projects in the University. *It is not the size of individual contributions that will matter, but rather the number and consistency of the contributors.* The goal of the University is to attract one million faithful friends who make annual donations of at least one thousand naira (N1000) each. This will amount to about One Billion Naira each year, enough to embark on major developmental projects each year for the University.

Other major Fund raising strategies of the University include the establishment of UNIMED Consults and organisation of Short Course Programmes

ESTABLISHMENT OF A FUND-RAISING COMMITTEE AND ADVANCEMENT OFFICE

To achieve its fund raising objectives a Fund-Raising Committee was established. Membership of the committee, chaired by a member of the university's Governing Council, High Chief Olusola Adeduro, also includes the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar. Apart from the committee, which has the primary responsibility of raising funds for the institution, the Advancement and Documentation Unit was also created in March 2016. The unit under the supervision of a director also has a fund raising programme officer.

Both the Fund raising Committee and the A&D unit have continued to supervise the university's drive for generating funds, especially through the FUF.

The unit has also secured new sources of funds for the University; received, acknowledged and tracked all donations and pledges; and assisted in the development, production and dissemination of support materials for fund raising activities

TRANSPARENT BUDGET, FINANCIAL AND AUDIT PROCEDURES

BUDGET AND FINANCIAL PROCEDURES

The establishment of a new institution requires significant financial investments and the budgetary, audit and financial procedures of this institution can determine its survival or orchestrate its demise. At UNIMED, the culture of honesty, transparency and consistency set forth by the Vice Chancellor is the basis of the Bursary, Audit and other financial departments. The University is dedicated to utilize all acquired funds judiciously and only for the sole purpose of developing the University while actualizing its vision, mission and goals.

To accomplish the day-to-day accurate and transparent financial management of the University, the duties of the Bursary Department since inception have included the following; received incomes: i.e. school fees and other revenues, subventions (capital and recurrent) from the State Government on behalf of the University, made duly approved payments to creditors and staff of the University, represented the University as a liaison between the management and the appointed University bankers, advised the management on financial matters, monitored closely the University's funds deposited in all its bank accounts, effectively utilised and managed the limited number of personnel in order to achieve maximum results, etc (See Appendix for our first year audited financial report).

INTERNAL/EXTERNAL AUDITING

The auditing of the University's finances is an important part of the goal for accuracy and transparency. The Internal Audit Department have been responsible for the verification of all financial transactions conducted by the University or its designees. To prevent conflict of interest and in an attempt to also verify the internally audited University accounts, machineries were set in motion to develop a comprehensive plan with the appointment of an external audit Consultant to facilitate the process leading to the preparation of the first external audit document of the University (See Appendix for the external Audit Document). The external audit was conducted in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Nigerian Accounting Standards Board, International Standards on Auditing of non-profit making organizations and with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. It also included an assessment of the estimates and judgments made by the University officers in the preparation of the Financial Statements. The result of the external audit revealed the University kept proper books of accounts and the Financial Statements were in agreement with the books.



At the time of establishment of the University, it had no building of its own hence its initial administrative activities were conducted at one of the offices at the Trauma Centre of the Medical Village.

To secure a firm base for the future expansion of the University, the government acquired about 100 hectares of land surrounding the existing medical village. As an interim arrangement however, the proposed Pathology unit of the medical village was ceded to the University to serve as the temporary office of the Vice-Chancellor/administrative block.

From this humble beginning however the University has made significant progress in terms of developing its infrastructures. Some of the notable infrastructural development projects are:

A. ANATOMY BUILDING

The building, constructed through direct labour, houses the Gross Anatomy, Embryology, Histology practical and preparatory laboratories. It also consists of the morgue room, behavioural testing room, laboratory technology offices, and the museum.










B. ANIMAL HOUSE

The Animal House, also constructed through direct labour, serves as a habitat for experimental animals.







C. FACULTY OF BASIC MEDICAL SCIENCES
The Faculty building was constructed by the Ondo State Government for the University. The building currently houses the library, lecture hall, the Physiology and Biochemistry laboratories.











D. FACULTY OF SCIENCE

The building is located at the Adeyemi College of Education (ACE), Ondo. The building, which was loaned to the University by the ACE authorities was rehabilitated, renovated and refurbished by UNIMED. It currently serves as lecture halls, staff offices and laboratories for the Faculty.



E. FACULTY OF BASIC CLINICAL SCIENCES
The building, currently under construction, is donated by Chief Isaac Akintade, the Saibi Gogou of Ondo Kingdom.
The building is expected to be completed before the end of the year 2016. When completed, it will house the Departments of Chemical Pathology, Haematology, Etc.















F. THE ODOSIDA CAMPUS

The Campus will serve as the new administrative building of the University. The Office of the Vice-Chancellor is also expected to move to the new site. The Campus is also expected to house the proposed University Health Centre and the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences.







G. THE UNITED NATIONS HABITAT FOR HUMANITY PROJECT

The University submitted proposals and was shortlisted as one of the beneficiaries under the UN Habitat Project. The Project includes the construction of Students' hostels and Staff accommodation facilities.

CUTTING-EDGE ACADEMIC DEVELOPMENT

mpartation of knowledge is the most important objective of any tertiary institution of learning. In-depth knowledge is acquired only when sound academic policies are not only put in place but are duly executed by institutions of learning. The University of Medical Sciences, in furtherance of its mission, promotes academic development through cutting-edge activities. Notable steps taken toward achieving outstanding and distinctive academic development by the University include:

A) DEVELOPMENT OF ACADEMIC BRIEF

At the time of the appointment of the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar in 2015, not much academic planning had taken place and the National Universities Commission (NUC) had therefore not been approached for formal recognition of the University.

In a bid to set things right from the scratch and to lay a proper and strong foundation upon which its academic activities will be built, the Vice-Chancellor working with Professor Eugene Okpere (a government-appointed Consultant whom he met on ground) and Professor Tolu Odugbemi, FAS, OON, NNOM (former Vice-Chancellor of the Ondo State University of Technology, Okitipupa, (who worked *pro bono*) developed the draft Academic Brief and physical plan of the University.

A draft of the Academic Brief was further revised by a team of experts from various medical disciplines. The team which was constituted by the Vice-Chancellor had to fine-tune the draft to meet the requirements of the NUC. Members of the team include: Professor Sola Ogunniyi (Internal medicine), Professor O Fatusi (Community Medicine), Professor Akin Ojo (Dentistry), Professor Obuekwe (Dentistry), Professor A Omonkhua (Biochemistry), Dr. Eze (Anatomy) and Professor Abhor Ighorodje (Physiology).

B) NUC RECOGNITION, VISITS AND RESOURCE VERIFICATION

Upon conclusion of the exercise, the revised Academic Brief together with the Law establishing the University was presented by the Governor of Ondo State to the NUC and the University was officially recognized by the NUC as the 40th State University and the 139th University in Nigeria on April 22, 2015.

This official recognition was followed up by the University's invitation to the NUC to assess its resources and facilities before enrolment of students into its medical programmes. The NUC in response to the invitation, conducted the first resource verification visit to the University on December 7, 2015 and consequently approved the following programmes to be run by the University:

- 1) Faculty of Clinical Sciences: MBBS
- 2) Faculty of Dentistry: BDS
- 3) Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences: Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry

In a bid to ensure expansion whilst not compromising standards, efforts are currently being made to introduce new courses and plans are in the pipeline to obtain the necessary approvals and commence programmes in Physiotherapy, Nursing, Physics (with options in Physics electronics and medical Physics), Chemistry, Mathematics and Biological sciences (with options in Microbiology, Animal and environmental biology, Plant biology and Biotechnology).

On October 11, 2016, the University inaugurated the board of the proposed UNIMED School of Public Health. The School is among other things to develop a strategic plan for the public health programmes of the University and to identify courses and curricula for the Departments.

C) CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT AND ACADEMIC DEPARTMENTS

The following Departments and Centres currently exist in the University: the Department of Biological sciences, Department of Anatomy, Department of Biochemistry, Department of Physiology, Department of Community Health, Department of Physics and the Centre for General and Entrepreneurship studies.

To ensure that the departmental academic activities are carried out in compliance with existing and acceptable standards, the University set up a Curriculum Development Committee which has the mandate to develop sound and qualitative academic curriculum for the existing Departments in the University.

The Curriculum Development Committee comprising of notable Professors in the respective fields of medical sciences, received valuable contributions from the lecturers in the respective departments and met to consider and update the various contributions as they deemed necessary.

A comprehensive curriculum has thus been drawn up for each Department in the University. The intention is to



regularly review and update the existing curriculum to ensure that it meets up with international standards and trends.

D) UNIVERSITY LIBRARY AND E-LEARNING FACILITIES


The University Library exists to serve the objective of its parent organization, and as such, the University Library must not only circulate knowledge but must also support teaching, research and community service. In furtherance of this, the University in July, appointed a Special Adviser on Library Resources to assist with the acquisition of relevant books and journals.

The University Library is currently housed in a temporary building within the University with a sitting capacity for 150 readers pending the construction of a permanent University Library building.

The University currently provides open access to Library resources through the use of Library catalogues and online facilities; reprographic services; selective dissemination of information (SDI); and internet services. Plans are in progress to automate the operations of the Library. When completed, it would enhance the Universities operations by introduction of Cataloguing, Serials, Acquisitions, Administration and Special Collection modules.

The University Library currently has over 2000 volumes of books and subscribes to several foreign and local journals. This is in addition to several books and journal accessed through our e-library and academic database.

Librarians in the University Library are also involved in teaching of the GES 112 (Use of Library, Study Skills, and Information and Communication Technology).





E) GUEST LECTURES

As a way of promoting town-and-gown relationship, the University has instituted the guest lecture series. The series is aimed at disseminating information from the academia to the community on varied national and topical issues, especially as they relate to health matters.









THE 1ST DISTINGUISHED GUEST LECTURE

The first distinguished lecture series titled "We Reap What We Sow" was delivered by the Emeritus Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology and a former Vice-Chancellor of the University of Port Harcourt, Professor Kelsey A. Harrison MD, DSc. (London), FRCOG, FMCOG held on Wednesday 15th June, 2016.

The maiden Lecture was well attended by heads of tertiary institutions, representatives of clinical and academic community as well as dignitaries from diverse backgrounds.







The University has also fixed its first Founder's Day Lecture for Thursday December 8, 2016. The Lecture will be delivered by the Executive Secretary of the NUC, Prof. Rasheed Abubakar.

F) SHORT-TERM TRAINING PROGRAMMES

1. The University conducted a 2-week Certificate course on: "Maternal mortality prevention in West and Central Africa". The Course which was hosted by the University was conducted in collaboration with the Centre of Excellence in Reproductive Health Innovation (CERHI), University of Benin and the Mother and Child Hospital, Ondo. The Course took place from 2nd to 12th May, 2016 and was attended by participants from institutions in Nigeria and other African countries.

2. In August 2016, the University organised a workshop on Master Grant Proposal Writing and Financial Management in Tertiary Institutions. Facilitators at the 3-day course included serving and former Vice-Chancellors and administrators with notable experience in the areas of focus. The short course took place from 22nd to 24th August, 2016 at the Lecture Hall of the Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences.









G) UNIMED RESEARCH, PUBLICATIONS AND TRAINING COMMITTEE

In June 2016, the Vice Chancellor constituted the Research, Publications and Training Committee of the University. The Committee had its inaugural meeting on 17th June, 2016.

Since its inception, the Committee has received and considered proposals for the TETFUND Institution-based Research Intervention and the shortlisted proposals are being finalised for submission to the TETFUND office in

The Committee serves as a collation unit for all research publications of the University. The Committee also actively disseminates information on research opportunities, conferences, fellowship and grants available to staff.

H) UNIMED WEEKLY RESEARCH SEMINARS

In October 2016, the Vice Chancellor introduced the compulsory Weekly Research Seminars for all academic staff of the University. The research seminars creates a platform for members of the University Community to present their ongoing or proposed research proposals to their colleagues for comments, queries and other perspectives which will further assist the researchers to conduct a more qualitative and academically sound research exercise.





I) STUDENT SATISFACTORY SURVEY
In a bid to ensure that the relevant needs of the students are given utmost priority in the infrastructural development of the University, a students' survey was conducted at the end of the first semester, 2015/2016 academic session. The questionnaire-based survey was conducted to ascertain the students' perception and views on the facilities in place at the University.









At the end of the survey, the students were adjudged to be largely satisfied with the academic and infrastructural facilities available.



J) LECTURERS' EVALUATION SURVEY
The University Senate at its 11th Statutory Meeting constituted a Committee for the evaluation of all lecturers in the employment of the University. The parameters on which the Lecturers were to be evaluated include, the lecturers' punctuality, teaching abilities, relationship with students, and accessibility to students, among others.









At the end of the 2015/2016 academic session, the Committee in furtherance of its mandate distributed the questionnaires which were filled anonymously by the students and the data obtained from the forms is currently being analysed by the Academic Planning Division.

PLAN TO DEVELOP A HERBAL MEDICINAL FARM







Distribution of Students by Gender




Distribution of Total Staff by Gender









Students' distribution by Department








Percentage of Teaching Staff with Ph.D

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following is a summary of the significant Accounting Policies adopted by the University in the preparation of the Financial Statements.

i. BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The Financial Statements of the University have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

ii. FIXED ASSETS

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

iii. DEPRECIATION

Depreciation of Fixed Assets is calculated on the straight-line basis at the following rates to write off their cost over their estimated useful lives.

Land and Buildings Motor Vehicles 25% 15% Furniture and Fittings Plant and Office Equipment 15% Science Laboratory and Other Equipment 20% Library Books 5% Computer and ICT Facilities 121/2%

However, no provision has been made for depreciation in these accounts because most of the concerned assets were put into use for a period less than three (3) months during the reported period.

iv. STOCKS

Stocks are stated at Cost or Net Realizable Value.

v. COMPARATIVE FIGURES

The Financial Statements are the first set of statements to be prepared by the University: hence, there are no comparative figures.



FAMILY BACKGROUND

hief (Dr.) Isaac Folorunso Akintade was born in Ondo City, Ondo State on August 15, 1942 into two prominent families in Ondo Kingdom. His father, late Pa Akintade Fawehinmi, was a direct descendant of the famous and dreaded Lisa Alujannu while his mother, Princess Aderosotu was a daughter of the late Oba Jisomosun Adekolurejo of Ondo Kingdom.

EDUCATION

Chief (Dr.) Akintade started his elementary education at St. Andrew's Primary School Ondo in 1950 and obtained his Elementary School Leaving Certificate in 1957. He later proceeded to the local Authority Modern School in 1959 and graduated in 1961. In his quest for more knowledge, he again attended the Federal Government Teacher's Training College Ilesha, Osun State where he had his Grade II Teachers Certificate before travelling to the United States of America (USA) for further studies.

While in USA, he attended Armstrong High School Washington DC, and went to the Federal City College, now university of the District of Columbia where he bagged is Bachelor's Degree in Economics in 1972. He was later given an American Scholarship to study at the Western Illinois University, Macomb, Illinois, where he obtained his Masters Degree in Quantitative and Analytical Economics with Honors in the year 1974 and had AIB Final Certificate from the American Institute of Banking, Washington D.C in 1976.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Chief (Dr.) Akintade returned to Nigeria in 1976 and started working at the Research Department of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN). While at the CBN, Chief (Dr.) Akintade was saddled with the responsibility of collating and analyzing data from all the banks in the Federation so as to determine the money in circulation and any other information to determine the condition of the Nigerian economy.

Chief (Dr.) Akintade moved to the Federal Ministry of Trade in 1978 to acquire experience in the running of businesses in order to fulfill his lifelong desire of running his own business. While at the Federal Ministry of Commerce, Chief Akintade was in charge of Import License for the whole Federation. He was also the Chairman of the Import Quota Allocation Committee. He finally retired from Government Service in 1983.

All his life, Chief (Dr.) Akintade has always struggled to help his people and uplift their welfare. Indeed, his life has been a life of service to his people, especially the down trodden. So



immediately after his stint at the Central Bank and the Federal Ministry of Commerce, he joined Famak Nigeria Ltd, a company he co-founded, as an Executive Director. He is currently the Managing Director and Chief Executive of the company. As a result of his high interest in banking and his desire to assist some of his people who could not get credit facilities from the conventional banks, Chief (Dr.) Akintade also co-founded the Ekimogun Microfinance Bank where he is the current Chairman of the Bank.

One of the most enduring contributions of Chief (Dr.) Akintade to the economic well being of his people, especially those in the transport sector, is the establishment of the Famak Line. Chief (Dr.) Akintade is the current Patron of the Ondo State Branch of the National Union of Road Transport Workers (NURTW). He has helped so many drivers in Ondo State own vehicles by way of giving them buses at highly subsidized rates. In addition to the above, Chief (Dr.) Akintade has also distributed so many mini taxi cabs to the indigenes of Ondo City to ease the township transportation.

As a result of his prowess in the transport sector, Chief (Dr.) Akintade was made the Chairman of the National Association of Road Transport Owners (NARTO) Ondo State and later the Chairman of the body in the entire Western Zone in Nigeria. He later became the Deputy National President of NARTO in Nigeria as well as the President NARTO Cooperative Society in Lagos Sate before bowing out of the organization.

CHIEF (DR.) ISAAC AKINTADE AS A POLITICIAN

Having seen great potential in Chief (Dr.) Akintade, the late Oba F. I. Adesanoye, the paramount Ruler of Ondo Kingdom then, invited Chief (Dr.) Akintade to join politics so as to assist Ondo Kingdom achieve its maximum potential in politics. He later invited the current Governor of Ondo State, His Excellency, Dr. Olusegun Mimiko and I into his bedroom where he placed the hands of the Governor into my hands and blessed us saying that the politics of Ondo State was in our hands.

Chief (Dr.) Akintade became the Leader of Labour Party in Ondo Kingdom and Chairman of Elders' Council of the Party in Ondo State. Chief (Dr.) Akintade is proud to have led Labour Party that broke the jinx and resulted in the installation of the first Ondo Kingdom born Executive Governor of Ondo State in the person of Dr. Olusegun Mimiko.

Chief (Dr.) Akintade served on the Board of Owena Oil and Gas until December 2006 when he resigned to join the Labour Party. Chief (Dr.) Akintade served as a Director of Odua Investment Company until December 2013 and he is the current Chairman of Odua Investment Co. Ltd.

Chief (Dr.) Akintade is an entrepreneur per excellence. He has contributed immensely to the development of Ondo State in particular and Nigeria in general.
