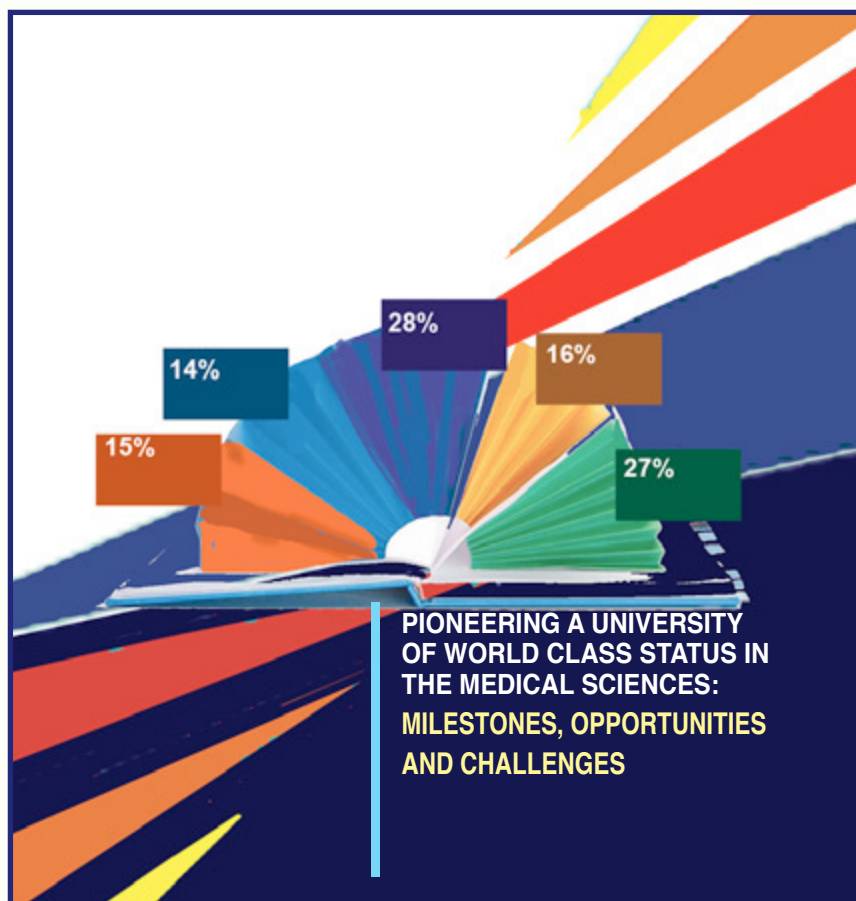

Professor Friday Okonofua, MD, PhD, ad eundem FRCOG, is a medical doctor and a professor of obstetrics and gynecology at the University of Benin for many years. He is a fellow of the West African College of Surgeons, the Nigerian Postgraduate Medical College, the International College of Surgeons, the International Health program at Harvard University, and the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. He also has PhD in International Health from the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm, Sweden. He is a Fellow of both the Nigerian Academy of Science (FAS) as well as the New York Academy of Science.

Okonofua commenced his academic career as Lecturer 1 in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Obafemi Awolowo University in 1986. He served as the Acting Head of Department between 1987 and 1992, and rose to the post of Professor in 1992. He transferred his services to the University of Benin in 1996, where he had been the Head of Department, Dean, Provost, and member of the University's Governing Council.

He has also been Secretary of the Faculty of Obstetrics and Gynecology of the National Postgraduate College of Nigeria, as well as the Secretary-General of the Society of Gynecology and Obstetrics of Nigeria. Between April 2005 and November 2009, he served as the Executive Director of the International Federation of Gynecology and Obstetrics (FIGO), supervising projects management in the 110 member countries of the organization. He was also an Honorary Adviser on Health to President Olusegun Obasanjo from July 2006 to May 29, 2007.

Professor Okonofua is a champion of women's health, a discipline where he has published more than 200 refereed articles.

He is a recipient of more than 40 research grants, and he is a member of several international organizations and committees, including the editorial board of the British Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology, where he has served for more than 12 years. He has attended and presented scientific papers in 100 conferences in up to 40 countries around the world. He is a reviewer to 20 international journals, and a technical consultant to many international agencies, including the World Health Organisation, the Macarthur Foundation and the Ford Foundation.

He is a recipient of several honors, including the Distinguished Alumnus Award of the Obafemi Awolowo University, Special Achievers Award by the Nigerian Television Authority, Distinguished Services Award by the Society of Gynecology and Obstetrics of Nigeria, Award of "the most outstanding professor of the people" by the Students Union Government of the University of Benin.

He was also recently honoured by the VC of UNIBEN for contributions to the success of the university where he served in many capacities for many years before he was appointed the pioneer VC of UNIMED by Former Governor Olusegun Mimiko.

Prof. Okonofua was also on December 2, 2016 honoured with the chieftaincy title of Gbekoleke of Ondo Kingdom by the Osemawe of Ondo Kingdom, Oba (Dr.) Victor Kiladejo.

PROFESSOR ODUNAYO M. OLUWATOSIN

DEPUTY VICE CHANCELLOR
(ADMINISTRATION/CLINICAL), UNIMED



Professor Odunayo M. Oluwatosin is a Professor of Surgery. He attended Igbobi College, Yaba, Lagos, (1969-1973) and University of Ibadan (UI) (1973-1979). He had his residency training at University College Hospital (UCH), Ibadan; Shotley Bridge Hospital, Consett, County Durham; Manor Hospital, Nuneaton, North Warwickshire and Whiston Hospital, Prescot, Merseyside. He is a Fellow of the Medical College of Surgeons (Nigeria) and of the West African College of Surgeons. He obtained the Certification of the Royal College of Surgeons, England (Plastic Surgery) in 1991 and was appointed Lecturer I at UI in 1992. He became Head of Surgery at UI in 2004, Chairman, Medical and Dental Consultants' Association of UCH (1991-2001); President of the Nigerian Association of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons (2005-2007), Dean, Faculty of Clinical Sciences, UI, (2006 – 2010) and President of Christian Medical and Dental Association of Nigeria (2012 to 2016).

Apart from the training of health care personnel including medical Students, surgical residents, nurses and physiotherapists, Professor Oluwatosin has secured/ participated in several grants including: Dreyfus Health Foundation Grant, USA, 1995 (Comparison of honey and phenytoin in the treatment of chronic leg ulcers); NIH, USA (collaboration with University of Connecticut), 2005 (Genetic study of keloids); EDULINK, EU (collaboration with five medical schools in West Africa and TET Fund, UK on Teaching Skills in West African Medical and Nursing Schools, M.Sc. Biomedical education), 2007.

Professor Oluwatosin was instrumental to the popularization of the use of honey in the management of wounds nationwide in 1987, establishment of the first and still the only regular microvascular free tissue transfer course in sub-Saharan Africa and of M.Sc. Medical and Biomedical Education course which was the 1st distant learning postgraduate course in University of Ibadan and the first of its kind in West Africa. The title of his inaugural lecture delivered in November, 2007 is "The road to success is always under construction".

PROFESSOR ADESEYE MUYIWA AROGUNJO

DEPUTY VICE CHANCELLOR
(ACADEMICS), UNIMED



Professor Arogunjo, Adeseye Muiyiwa was born on August 17, 1966 in Ipe, Ondo State. He attended St. Michael Primary School, IpeAkoko from 1973 – 1979 and proceeded to Ayegbe Grammar School, IpeAkoko, Ondo State, for his secondary education from 1979 – 1984. He obtained his BSc degree as the best graduating Student in Physics from the University of Ilorin in 1991 and thereafter proceeded to the University of Ibadan where he obtained a Master's Degree in Radiation and Health Physics. In 2002, he bagged his PhD in Radiation and Health Physics from the Federal University of Technology, Akure (FUTA).

Professor Arogunjo started his academic career as a Tutorial/ Practical Demonstrator at the University of Ibadan in 1992. He proceeded to the FUTA in 1995 as an assistant lecturer. He rose through the ranks to become a Professor in the Department of Physics in 2010.

In 2003, he was a Research fellow at the International Centre for theoretical Physics (ICTP) in the framework of TRIL programme at the Di FisicaMedica, Universitadeglistudi di Milano, Italy. He was in Germany from 2006 to 2007 as an Alexander von Humboldt Fellow at the International Fellowship of Alexander von Humboldt at GSF - Institut für Strahlenschutz, AG Medizinische Physik, Ingolstädter Landstr. 1, Neuherberg - Germany.

Prof. A.M Arogunjo has been on leave with the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo from the commencement of its academic activities in the Faculty of Science in 2016. His services in the University has been valuable and he has made very significant contributions to the development of the University and hence his appointment as the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic). He is also the current Dean, Faculty of Science.

At various times, he has received both national and international research grants and awards including the University of Ilorin Scholar award 1989/90 and 1990/91 academic Sessions; the FUTA Staff Development Grant, Federal University of Technology, Akure, Ondo State in 1998 which covers tuition fee and an additional sum of N50,000.00; the Best Corp liaison officer of the Year, National Youth Service Corps, Taraba State – 1992; the Taraba State NYSC merit award winner, 1992; the Alexander von Humboldt Return Fellow Grant on the project titled “Determination of uranium and thorium intake in local foodstuffs and the radiological impact on the daily urinary excretion of unexposed population in Nigeria” (Euro 6,500); the Alexander von Humboldt Book Grant (Euro 1,000); and the Alexander von Humboldt Equipment Grant (Euro 20,000).

Professor Arogunjo has attended several national and international Conferences and has served on various University Committees at different times. In the course of his career, he has supervised numerous Masters and PhD Students and served as external supervisor to different Universities.

He has about 50 publications in peer-reviewed journals and Conference proceedings. He is a reviewer for both national and international journals including: the Radiation Protection Dosimetry, Oxford University Press, UK; the Journal of Environmental Sciences, UK; the Nigeria journal of Pure and Applied Physics, Nigeria; and the Journal of Applied Sciences, Pakistan.

Professor Arogunjo is a member of the Nigerian Institute of Physics (NIP); Science Association of Nigeria (SAN); Nigerian Society of Radiological Protection (NSRP); and the International Radiological Protection Association (IRPA)

On December 8, 2014, the Former Executive Governor of Ondo State, His Excellency, Dr. Olusegun Mimiko, CON, signed the Ondo State University of Medical Sciences Law 2014. In March 2015, He approved the appointment of the first Vice-Chancellor, Professor Friday Okonofua, FAS and the first Registrar, Dr. (Mrs.) Eunice Funke Oyebade, mni. The existing “Medical Village”, comprising the Mother and Child Hospital, Trauma Centre, the Kidney Care Centre and the GaniFawehinmi Diagnostic Centre, was to be integrated into the University and formed its take-off administrative and resource base. The surrounding 100 hectares of land was acquired by the government to allow future expansion of the University.

At the time of the appointment of the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar, not much physical, infrastructural, academic and administrative planning had taken place and the National Universities Commission (NUC) had therefore not been approached for formal recognition of the University. With the instrument establishing the University by the Ondo State Government, the new University therefore approached the NUC for official recognition, which was given on April 22, 2015.

In presenting the letter of recognition to the Former Executive Governor, Dr Olusegun Mimiko, CON, the Executive Secretary of the NUC said inter alia: “I wish to congratulate the Government and people of Ondo State for this establishment of the Ondo State University of Medical Sciences. With effect from 22nd April, 2015, the Ondo State University of Medical Sciences has been recognised by the National Universities Commission as the 40th State University and the 139th University in Nigeria. It is however advised that the University should invite the NUC to assess the resources and facilities before the enrolment of Students into the medical programmes”.

Despite the recognition given by the NUC, the University could not begin official administrative work until July 2015 due to resource and funding constraints. It was only then that some Staff were appointed and the framework for administrative duties was established.

The Governing Council of the university (not currently active) under the able former chairmanship of Emeritus Professor Oladipupo Akinkugbe, FAS, CFR was inaugurated by Former Governor Olusegun Mimiko, CON on November 16, 2015 thus signalling the readiness of the university to commence academic activities.

On December 7, 2015, an advisory team of the NUC visited the university, apparently to appraise its readiness to commence academic activities. The NUC visit was followed on December 9 by the team of the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN). The two regulatory bodies were satisfied with their findings even as they dropped hints of areas in which they expected further efforts. The MDCN later wrote to the VC that it was impressed by what the University had on ground. In the letter, the MDCN Registrar, Dr. A. A. Ibrahim, said, "Following the advisory visitation to your university on Wednesday, December 9, 2015 by a team from the MDCN that inspected your facilities, personnel and curriculum of study, I write to convey Council's satisfaction with the ongoing efforts at properly establishing your medical school."

Barely one month after the NUC and MDCN visits, the University on January 5, 2016 released its first admission list while its pioneer Students started arriving at their halls of residence on January 10, 2016. There was no stopping UNIMED from then on as various activities including registration of Students, orientation and commencement of classes were accomplished in record time. A total of 192 pioneer Students, spread across five programmes including Medicine, Dentistry, Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry were matriculated on March 5, 2016. The university was also formally inaugurated by Former Governor Olusegun Mimiko, CON on the same day. Within its short life, the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo, has established itself as a stakeholder to reckon with in the national health and education sectors.

On June 15, 2016 the university held its First Distinguished Lecture, drawing to the campus Top Academics, Distinguished Medical Practitioners and other stakeholders to listen to the Guest Lecturer, Emeritus Professor Kelsey Harrison, a former VC of the University of Port Harcourt. Since then, the University has followed in the Success of the First Distinguished Lecture with its Second Distinguished Guest Lecture which took place in May 2017 delivered by Professor Joseph Balogun, a distinguished Professor of Physiotherapy at the Chicago State University, USA. In August 2017, the University held its inaugural Annual Public Lecture delivered by Professor Joseph Iboimeim Okogun, an Emeritus Professor of Chemistry, University of Ibadan. The University also just successfully held its Third Distinguished Lecture which took place in October 2017 delivered by Professor Muhammad Ali Pate, a former Nigerian Minister of State for Health, a Distinguished Professor of Global Health at the Duke University, USA, and a visiting Professor of Public Health at several Universities including Harvard University and the London School of Public Health.

On July 7, 2016, the University similarly attracted top Government Functionaries, Academics, Royal Fathers, Captains of Industries and other citizens to the epoch-making launching of the Friends of UNIMED Fund (FUF). The scheme, FUF, is a novel effort by the University's management to create a pool of friends who will contribute to the funding of the University. In its bare form, the FUF aims at raising one million friends who are committed to contributing at least One Thousand Naira annually to fund the university both nationally and internationally. The scheme has continued to excite Nigerians as well as attract donors who are eager to contribute far more than the minimum. The University has also been registered under the King Boudin Foundation of the United States (KBFUS) to help streamline the donations of the American based donors. In addition to cash, UNIMED friends have contributed other items including office equipment's and other facilities. The biggest donor to the scheme so far is Chief (Dr.) Isaac Akintade JP, the Sarowo of Ondo Kingdom, who has completed construction of the multi-million Naira Faculty of Basic Clinical Sciences building he pledged under the FUF.

NOTES FROM THE VICE-CHANCELLOR



Introduction

It is with great excitement and enthusiasm that I address you after our second year of operation.

I wish to thank all those who have supported the University to this point. In particular, I wish to thank the articulate, technocratic and very dynamic Executive Governor of the State, His Excellency Arakunrin Oluwarotimi Akeredolu, SAN for his efforts in supporting the first University devoted to the Medical Sciences in the whole of West Africa. Sir, once again, I would like to congratulate you on your election to this Distinguished High Office, and pray that the good Lord will give you the wisdom, guidance and protection to take Ondo State to a higher level of development.

I also wish to thank those who work with Mr. Governor in efforts to fulfill the aims and objectives of this unique University. There are many individuals to acknowledge, but let me particularly recognize the Osemawe of Ondo Kingdom, His Royal Majesty, Dr. Oba Victor Kiladejo Jilo III, he has been my key adviser and supporter since I took office as Vice-Chancellor. I would also like to appreciate the Hon Commissioner for Health, Commissioner for Finance and the Commissioner for Education, and indeed, all members of the University's Senate who have always stood like Rocks of Gibraltar behind every effort made

by the University. I wish to once again sincerely thank our neighboring institutions, especially the Adeyemi College of Education and National University of Educational Planning and Administration (NIEPA) for the support they continue to provide to the University. Indeed, the Provost of the Adeyemi College of Education, Professor Ogen has remained a veritable adviser, I will forever be grateful to him for being a significant resource and supporter of the University since its inception. Indeed, the University is keeping foundational records of these contributions. When the history of this University is written, the names of all contributors at this stage of its infancy will be written in gold.

University's Mission and Vision Statements

As this represents the second birthday of the University, it is appropriate that we remind everyone of the mission and vision of the University.

The mission of UNIMED is: "To provide exceptional quality and comprehensive health care and integrated education and research in all health-related sciences, to expand access to compassionate and high-quality health care for under-served populations, and to lead the scientific pathway for reducing the burden of disease in our areas of operation".

The vision of the University is "to be a thriving medical and health sciences University, locally, nationally and internationally recognized for excellence and innovation in health education and research, and for its ability to translate research findings for the improvement of health in communities with high burden of disease".

Our principal objective is to establish a 21st Century World-Class University of excellence in medical research, teaching and service delivery. I wish to let you know that the aforementioned mission and vision statements were developed after intense deliberations, and I to assure you, we are deeply committed to its actualization. This University will work assiduously and relentlessly to correct the mistakes that currently bedevil medical education and service delivery in this country. As the Vice-Chancellor, I wish to assure you that I will work with utmost patriotism and with deep commitment, transparency and accountability to achieve the best international benchmarks for the University within the shortest period of time.

UNIMED: Reflection on the Second Year

As most of you probably know, the University scaled through its first year with flying colors with major achievements including the approval given to it by the NUC to begin five Academic courses; Medicine, Dentistry, Biochemistry, Physiology, and Anatomy following the visit of a Resource Verification Team from the Commission to the University in December 2015. The Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN) also paid an advisory visit to the University in December 2015, and was impressed with the plans being put in place to establish the Medical and Dental programs of the university.

Since then, the University has made significant progress in all spheres. As of October 2017, the University has appointed a total number of 496 Staff (compared to 145 in 2016). The appointed Staff include 137 Academic Staff (50 in 2016), 55 Senior Administrative Staff (50 in 2016), 12 Senior Secretarial Staff (10 in 2016), 15 Senior Technical Staff (7 in 2016) and 77 Junior Staff (30 in 2016). We have also firmly organized and put all administrative and academic structures of the University in place accommodating all accredited programs.

Though the Governing Council is yet to be reactivated, the University Senate has been fully constituted and is meeting regularly to plan and drive the academic programs of the University. Indeed, all Committees including Senate has been fully established and are working well in accordance with the edict that established the University. The University is also building its administrative and academic infrastructures at a fast pace never before witnessed for newly established Universities in this country.

The University of Medical Sciences has truly come of age. Although we are only two years in existence, we have taken futuristic giant strides, making the University one of the strong institutions for training of health professionals in the county today. One of the major milestone achievements of the University this year is the accreditation of the Medical and Dental programs given to it by the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN). It is now evident that our first set of medical and dental practitioners will graduate in July 2019.

Matriculation

Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen, I am pleased to inform you that the University was able to admit its second set of Students in January 2017. This consisted of 496 Students (234 in 2016) admitted into

various courses in the University. This includes 68 admitted into Medicine (97 in 2016); 32 into Dentistry (28 in 2016); 65 into Nursing; 38 into Anatomy (22 in 2016); 30 into Biochemistry (19 in 2016); 27 into Biological Sciences; 35 into Microbiology; 30 into Chemistry; 11 into Mathematics; 23 into Electronics Physics; 42 into Medical Physics; 35 into Physiology (23 in 2016) and 60 into Physiotherapy. Students came into residence in January 2017. Most of the Students completed their registration formalities, which formed the basis of the University's successfully conducted second Matriculation ceremony in April 2017. The school fees charged by the University remains one of the lowest in the Country.

Matriculation signals the formal admission of the Students into the University, without which Students would still be regarded as ad-hoc rather than full-time Students. Accordingly, the second matriculation ceremony of the University was an important and crucial event which was celebrated proudly by Students, parents and all friends of the University. The Students took the Matriculation Oath during the ceremony to indicate their willingness to abide by the rules and regulations of the University.

University Sustainability Plans

At this time, I would like to address a pertinent subject matter that has been agitating the minds of friends and various stakeholders about the University, for which I continue to receive multiple questions. This is the sustainability of the University in view of the dwindling national and state resources. Let me once again reiterate the answer I have often given to everyone who has expressed this concern. A great idea is a great idea, it is not the lack of money that plagues our country, but the lack of creative and sustainable ideas. When great ideas are put forth, funding to drive the implementation of the idea will manifest, and of course all progressive people will support the idea. The establishment of the University of Medical Sciences is one of the most creative and innovative ideas that has taken place in the development of national and international tertiary education, especially the development of medical education in Nigeria. To that end, I remain convinced without any doubt that the University of Medical Sciences has not only come to stay, but will continue to be supported by all Nigerians in perpetuity.

During one of my earlier visits to the Executive Governor of Ondo State, His Excellency Arakunrin Oluwarotimi Akeredolu, SAN when he took office, I remember his wise and impactful words "we all have to find creative ways of generating funds." The



University of Medical Sciences established a multi-functional and professional fund-raising office headed by Professor Denis Abimbola Akintade, the Director of Advancement and Documentation to meet the anticipated challenges in financing, which indeed, ALL Nigerian Universities are facing at the present time. To date, the multi-faceted fund-raising efforts of the University have made tremendous progress, and we are hopeful that this will continue to be a significant aspect of the University's development and sustainability plan.

Friends of UNIMED Fund

The purpose of the "Friends of UNIMED Fund (FUF)" is to obtain the resources to grow the University to attain its mission and vision statements. The objectives of the FUF are twofold: 1) to build a multitude of friends for the University who will see themselves as stakeholders, and therefore be willing to make regular contributions towards the development of the University; and 2) to manage the Funds in a transparent, effective and accountable manner for specific identifiable projects on research, service delivery and development of the University.

The simple, yet innovative and effective idea of this initiative is to generate a cohort of friends for the University who will make regular, small and determined financial contributions towards the implementation of specific projects in the University. It is not the size of individual contributions that will matter, but rather the number and consistency of the donors. The goal of the University is to attract one million faithful friends who will make annual donations of at least one thousand naira (N1000) each. This will amount to about One Billion Naira each year, enough to embark on major developmental projects each year for the University. This Fund was launched in July and subsequent fund-raising ideas are in the works.

Appreciation of Donors

Let me at this point once again thank all those who attended both launches of the FUF in 2016 (Ondo and Abuja), those who visited the University, those who welcomed us into their homes on our several courtesy visits and those who have made various redeemed pledges and donations including Capital Projects, cash, furniture, electronics, etc. to the University over the past months. We are very grateful to all donors. In addition to external donors, I would like

to acknowledge the Staff and Students of the University who have donated and spread the word about the FUF. Your constant sacrifice and financial support to the advancement of the University has not gone unnoticed.

Conclusions

On behalf of the University Senate, Faculty, Staff and Students, I wish to thank you profusely for your interest in the University, your support and for reading this address. We wish to assure you of the deep commitment of all Principal Officers of the University (indeed, my personal commitment) to propel this noble idea of the great people of Ondo State to its highest level of potentiation. To this commitment, we are prayerful that the Almighty Lord will continue to give us wisdom, knowledge, understanding and good health to ensure its full realization to the entire benefit of Nigerians and Africans alike.

ADDRESSING THE OBJECTIVES OF THE UNIVERSITY

The specific objectives for establishing and sustaining UNIMED are as follows:

- To prepare Students for leading professional roles in all disciplines in the health sector in Nigeria and globally;
- To offer the best tertiary health care (including preventive and curative care) for all forms of diseases, disabilities and deformities that are prevalent in Nigeria specifically, and throughout the African region broadly;
- To promote research and creative work for transforming and improving the health of Nigerians and the world at large;
- To develop human and physical resources of the University to some of the best attainable standards in the world; and
- To promote the health and social well-being of Nigerians through engagement, outreach services and public education.

VICE-CHANCELLOR'S SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

GOAL: The goal of the foundation Vice-Chancellor of UNIMED is to position the University to support Nigeria's quest for high quality education, service delivery, research and innovation in the health sciences.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES: This goal would be attained through the following strategic objectives:

- 1) Build a transparent, effective and accountable governance that will establish the University on sound administrative and academic principles similar to those found in the best University traditions anywhere in the world;
- 2) Develop a multi-stakeholder funding base, and engender the sensible and accountable appropriation and use of the funds for the sustainable development of the University, especially to promote infrastructural and Staff development and boost teaching, clinical services and research activities;
- 3) Provide for the systematic infrastructural development of the University using the highest standards and models of architecture and physical planning for campus development;
- 4) Promote the academic growth of the University by ensuring full accreditation of all its academic courses within the shortest possible period of time, and increasing

academic and research outputs, with increased ranking of the University, overall; and

- 5) Support community out-reach services such that the University will immediately begin to address the socio-economic development and health problems of its immediate communities and be the lead institutional advisor on the developmental aspirations of the local community.

STRATEGIES FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES

The following strategies for achieving the specific objectives were identified in the foundational years of the institution. In line with the objectives, the following are done in the year of review:

- Governance and Administration
- Fund-raising for sustainable funding
- Transparent budget, financial and audit procedures
- Cutting-edge academic development
- Contributions to community development
- Academic Faculties and Departments review
- University Library and E-Learning Centre
- University Health Centre

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE UNIMED STRATEGIC PLAN

The University in its desire to achieve excellence and attain its vision and mission developed a 5-year strategic plan which had since become fully operational.

In accordance with the timelines for achieving its cardinal plans the following goals have been implemented:

1. Governance, Services and Management

The policy manuals and documents of the University have been prepared and made available to all Staff in order to ensure effective service delivery.

2. Community Services

One of the strategies UNIMED put in place to achieve its community services goal is the regular delivery of lecture series with a view to educating members of the public on contemporary issues in medical and other health related disciplines while fostering the town and gown relationships. The University have since successfully organised three distinguished guest lectures and one public lecture.



3. Curriculum and Academic Programmes

The Senate at its statutory meetings considered the curricula for the MBBS, BDS, Nursing Sciences and Physiotherapy programmes. In order to attain its vision as a leading University in the training of qualified and marketable health professionals in Sub-Saharan Africa, the University Senate approved the commencement of additional health related programmes during the 2016/2017 and 2017/2018 academic sessions. These health related programmes include Nursing Sciences, Physiotherapy, Medical Laboratory Sciences and other Science courses.

The University in October, 2017 received the approval for the pre-clinical accreditation for MBBS and BDS programmes. This is another phenomenal milestone in the University's desire at running an uninterrupted academic calendar.

4. Teaching and Learning Resources

With over 2500 books, 44 titles and 50 databases and online resources, the UNIMED Library which was established in 2016 is one of the best and fastest growing academic libraries in Nigeria. The library is equipped with facilities that will promote quality teaching, research and community services.

5. Research and Innovation

To implement its goal of becoming a centre for cutting edge research in Nigeria, the weekly academic seminar was organized for Staff of the university to cross fertilize research ideas this is with a view to improve the quality of research output through constructive contribution. The over twenty-three (23) weekly research seminars conducted have birthed novel and innovative research.

To further encourage the Staff, the University has earmarked certain amount of money to fund cutting edge research.

RETREATS, ADMINISTRATIVE TRAININGS AND WORKSHOPS

As part of the University's relentless efforts at achieving excellence in teaching, research and service delivery, Staff training, re-orientation and Staff motivation are on the priority list of the management.

Over the span of one year, the university has organised several training and retraining workshops/ seminars for its teaching and non-teaching Staff. In order to familiarize academic Staff of the University with the best teaching methods and skills required for effective teaching of the integrated medical and dental curriculum, a workshop on Pedagogy and Integrated Medical and Dental Curriculum was organized and carried out between Thursday 6th and Friday 7th July 2017.

Similarly, newly appointed Deans, HODs and Departmental Coordinators were trained on expected administrative duties of their positions. The workshop was held on Thursday, 10th August, 2017 with the aim of building capacity of Staff and to ensure that newly appointed Deans and HODs are alert to their new responsibilities.

STAFF WELFARE

Despite the shortfalls in monthly subvention and resources accrued to the University, the management has continued to improve Staff welfare. Apart from the significant progress made in the areas of contributory pensions scheme and the University Cooperative Society, the University is working out modalities to enlist its Health Center on the National Health Insurance Scheme. This scheme when fully operational will reduce the financial burden of Staff and their immediate family in assessing quality health services.

GOVERNANCE AND EFFECTIVE ADMINISTRATION

The University has adopted the "TEA" acronym in its governance and administration. The TEA approach which stands for Transparency, Effectiveness and Accountability is being actualized in all spheres of the University's administration. The present administration is operating an open governance policy system through the weekly meeting of Management, Deans and HODs with all Staff. The meeting which commenced last year is aimed at breaking communication barriers between management and Staff. All Staff are being briefed periodically on the finances of the University and are involved in the decision-making process through the committee system of governance.

THE UNIVERSITY REGISTRY

The University Registry is currently headed by an experienced administrator in the position of Acting Registrar, Mr. Adeyinka Adekalu following the end of tenure of the immediate past Registrar, Dr. Eunice F. Oyebade, mni. As at October, 2017, the University has a total number of 276 Staff members comprising of teaching and Non-teaching Staff.

PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

A practical measurement and evaluation procedure has been put in place to measure the performance of the various departments and units. Such performance evaluation mechanisms include: the periodic review of activities of departments/ units to assess

the impact and progress made so far, the use of lecturers' evaluation forms and Staff appraisal forms.

IMPLEMENTATION OF FUND-RAISING STRATEGIC PLAN

The University's fund-raising objective is to generate funds to finance the University's development projects in a short period of time as the national economic recession and the dwindling government resources has made it difficult for the University to depend on government funding alone.

To increase the University's funding sources, the Governing Council at its meeting held on February 18, 2016, decided to establish the Friends of UNIMED FUND (FUF) and Friends of UNIMED Network (FUN) for the purpose of obtaining the resources to grow the University to attain its mission and vision statements within a short period of time

The idea of FUF is to generate a cohort of friends for the university who will make regular, small and determined financial contributions towards the implementation of specific projects in the University. It is not the size of individual contributions that will matter, but rather the number and consistency of the contributors. The goal of the University is to attract one million faithful friends who make annual donations of at least one thousand naira (N1000) each. This will amount to about One Billion Naira each year, enough to embark on major developmental projects each year for the University.

The objectives of the UNIMED FUF are two fold:

1. To build a multitude of friends for the University who will see themselves as joint owners, and therefore be willing to make regular contributions towards the development of the University.
2. To manage the Fund in a transparent, effective and accountable manner for specific identifiable projects on research, service delivery and development of the University.

ACTIVITIES TO ATTAIN THE OBJECTIVES

Establishment of A Fund-Raising Committee and Advancement Office

The Advancement and Documentation Unit
The Advancement & Documentation Unit under the Vice Chancellors Office is primarily responsible for the University's

Fund-Raising drives. Since the establishment of the unit, the Advancement & Documentation department has been working tenaciously to raise funds for the University.

Its mandate includes sourcing for donations from individuals, government parastatals, corporate bodies, business organizations and foundations. The Unit also carries out the following responsibilities;

Raising funds for the University

- Maintaining strong relationships with current, major and individual donors.
- Strategizing and implementing efforts to secure new sources of funds and increase annual fundraising goals.
- Assisting the Fund Raising and Ceremonies Committee to co-ordinate special events.
- Receiveing, acknowledging and tracking all contributions, pledges and other payments.
- Maintaining updated mailing lists, donor lists and donor profiles.
- Overseeing the design and production of the University's communications, relative donor appreciation and recognition.
- Assisting in the development, production and dissemination of support materials for fund raising activities.

The Unit collaborates with the Public Relations Unit to perform the following;

- Overseeing the re-design, implementation and management of the Friend of UNIMED Trust Fund campaign;
- Overseeing the design and production of the UNIMED Quarterly Newsletter and Biweekly Bulletin;
- Assisting with the programme evaluation and production of the annual report;
- Maintaining relationships with individual and corporate donor.

Involvement of all Staff in Fund Raising:

The art of fund raising requires strong and visionary leadership. Behind the energetic, enthusiastic and influential leader of the University, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Friday Okonofua, FAS, who was the first donor to the FUF initiative, every Staff of the University has followed suit and are not only Friends of the University but also enlist others to join in the development of this unique learning environment.

BUDGET, FINANCIAL AND AUDIT PROCEDURES

BUDGET AND FINANCIAL PROCEDURES

At UNIMED, our mantra is TEA – Transparency, Efficiency and Accountability. This is the foundation of practice and operations for the Bursary, Audit and other financial departments. The University is dedicated to utilizing all acquired funds in a transparent and efficient manner. Every penny received by the University is accounted for and used prudently for the sole purpose of developing the University while actualizing its vision, mission and goals.

The Bursary Department duties include but not limited to the following:

1. Receipts of revenue: School fees, grants, subventions and so on
2. Payment to all segments of service providers and contractors
3. Advisory roles to the management on all financial matters
4. Annual budget preparation
5. Annual financial Records preparation
6. Represents the University as a liaison between the management and the appointed University bankers
7. Advised the management on financial matters, monitored closely the University's funds deposited in all its bank accounts
8. Effectively utilised and managed the limited number of personnel to achieve maximum results, etc. (See Appendix on Financial Statement and FUF Financial Statement).

INTERNAL/ EXTERNAL AUDITING

Auditing of the University's finances is an important part of the goal for accuracy and transparency. The Internal Audit Department has been responsible for the verification of all financial transactions conducted by the University or its designees.

The Internal Audit department strives hard to ensure that things are done according to the existing rules. The unit ensures that pre & post purchase audits are carried out, certify a post payment check is carried out 1st week of every month, ensures that records are properly kept and a strict internal control maintained, draws the attention of advance holders to their unretired cash advances and carries out weekly market surveys to verify prices of items and also perform physical verification of materials purchased.

To prevent conflict of interest and to also verify the internally audited University accounts, an external audit Consultant was appointed. The external audit was conducted in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Nigerian Accounting Standards Board, International Standards on Auditing of non-profit making organizations and with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. It also included an assessment of the estimates and judgments made by the University officers in the preparation of the Financial Statements. The result of the external audit revealed the University kept proper books of accounts and the Financial Statements correlated with the books. See appendix for the University's audited accounts (See Appendix for Audited Account details).

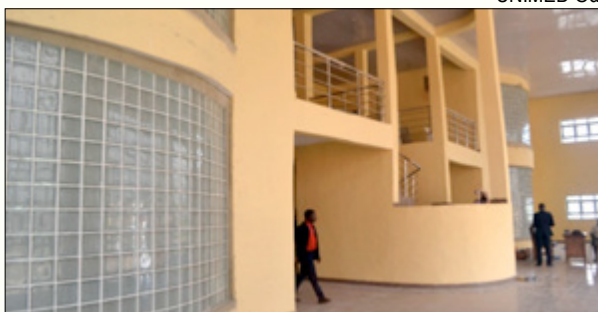

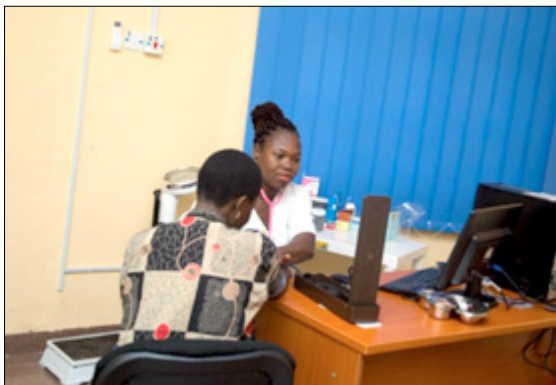

UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTER

The University Health Centre is located at the Odosida Campus and renders health care services to Students and Staff of the University of Medical Sciences. It became fully operational on the 1st of July, 2017 with the pioneering efforts of Dr. O. A. Adejumo, a Consultant Physician and Ag. Director of Health services.

The UNIMED Health Centre operates a fully computerized documentation system which distinguishes it from most Health Centres of other tertiary institutions in Nigeria. The Health Centre offers out-patient services to Students and Staff of the University. The Centre is open every day of the week. The fully equipped Center offers emergency services and in-patient care during working hours. Patients that cannot be treated at the Centre are referred to specialists at the Ondo State Trauma Centre, Kidney Care Centre and the Mother and Child hospital, Medical Village, Laje Road Ondo for investigations and specialist care when necessary.

Monthly departmental meetings and seminars are held at the UNIMED Health Center and aimed towards improving capacities and capabilities of the Health Center Staff to ensure that a high standard of care is delivered to the Students and Staff of the University. The University Health Centre has attended to 427 clients since its establishment. Efforts are presently on-going to register the Health Centre under a National Health Insurance Scheme. The Health Centre is also presently considering a proposal from Glaxo Smith Kline Pharmaceuticals with the aim of making vaccines such as Pneumovax, Hepatitis B vaccine and HPV vaccine readily accessible and affordable to Staff and Students of UNIMED and the community at large.

PUBLIC LECTURE

The University held the first in its public Lecture series on 31st August, 2017. The Lecture was delivered by the Emeritus Prof. Joseph I. Okogun- an Emeritus Professor of Chemistry and Consultant at the Pax Herbal Clinics and Research Laboratories, Benedictine Monastery Ewu.

The Wife of Ondo State Governor, Arabinrin Betty Anyanwu-Akeredolu who was the Distinguished Guest of Honor was in attendance and gave a speech during the Public Lecture. Also in attendance were dignitaries from both the academic community, key stakeholders in the healthcare sector and the general public.

The Guest Lecturer lamented the current domination of Nigerian market by foreign herbal remedies. He emphasised the presence of numerous effective herbal remedies in Nigeria and encouraged the development of herbal remedies from local resources through standardization of herbal products found to be efficacious and through research on medicinal plants.

He concluded by confirming the presence of anti-cancer properties in some Nigerian plants and herbs which are currently being consumed as food in Nigeria and urged researchers to expand the scope of their research work to identify these plants and herbs and to isolate the compounds of these herbs and plants which can be developed as anti-cancer drugs.

THE 3RD DISTINGUISHED GUEST LECTURE

On Thursday October 19, 2017, the University had the third in the Distinguished Guest Lecture series. The Lecture titled “The future of health and the promise of primary healthcare” was delivered by the former Minister of State for Health, Prof. Mohammed Ali Pate who was accompanied by very eminent dignitaries from across the country.

Whilst noting that the future of Nigeria and its population’s health is bright, the renowned Professor emphasized the need for bold and visionary leadership to realize the bright future. He also emphasized the need for both the private and public sector to improve in efficiency, effectiveness and quality of delivery of healthcare services.

Prof. Ali Pate particularly lamented the rate of medical tourism by Nigerians and the sad fact that majority of those who travel pay exorbitant prices and end up at private and not public hospitals in the countries where they abscond to. The fact that the amount expended on treatment at these private hospitals would have been a steady revenue stream to encourage the Nigerian private health sector and keep our foreign exchange in reserves. He urged the federal and state governments to collaborate with the Private Sector Health Alliance of Nigeria toward addressing policy, regulatory and capital constraints which have hindered the progress of the private sector health delivery in Nigeria. He equally urged the government to prioritize investment in training within the Nigerian health institutions of higher learning.

THE 2ND MATRICULATION CEREMONY

On Tuesday, 11th April, 2017 a total of four hundred and ninety six (496) 100 and 200 levels Students were matriculated into the thirteen (13) NUC approved Programmes of the University. This consisted of 496 Students (234 in 2016) admitted into various courses in the University. This includes 68 admitted into Medicine (97 in 2016); 32 into Dentistry (28 in 2016); 65 into Nursing; 38 into Anatomy (22 in 2016); 30 into Biochemistry (19 in 2016); 27 into Biological Sciences; 35 into Microbiology; 30 into Chemistry; 11 into Mathematics; 23 into Electronics Physics; 42 into Medical Physics; 35 into Physiology (23 in 2016) and 60 into Physiotherapy.

Students came into residence in January 2017. The Students took the Matriculation Oath during the ceremony to indicate their willingness to abide by the rules and regulations of the University. Most of the Students completed their registration formalities, which formed the basis of the University's successfully conducted second Matriculation ceremony in April 2017. The school fees charged by the University remain one of the lowest in the Country.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT AND PROPOSED FACULTY OF NURSING

The development of the innovative, integrated and competence-based MBBS Curriculum for the Faculty commenced in 2016. It was completed during the year under review and was approved in May, 2017 by the Senate of the University. The Curriculum for the Nursing Department was also presented to the Senate in the year under review. A proposal for the establishment of a Faculty of Nursing is also currently being considered.

PROPOSAL DEVELOPMENT AND PARTNERSHIPS

In July 2017, the Department of Biological Sciences submitted a 2017 Instrumental Access Application -a Seeding Labs Program that makes high-quality laboratory equipment available to universities and research institutes in low- and middle-income countries at an affordable price. Several other proposals for funding and partnerships were also finalized in the 2016/2017 session.

JOINT AFRICA CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE (ACE) 1 AND II WORKSHOP, ACCRA, GHANA

The University is one of the partner Institutions of the Centre of Excellence in Reproductive Health Innovation (CERHI), University of Benin. CERHI is one of the 9 World Bank funded Centres of Excellence in West Africa. The University was part of the CERHI Team that attended the ACE I and II Workshop which held at La Palm Hotel, Accra Ghana from November 7-9, 2017. The Workshop was also a networking opportunity for the University to initiate partnership and collaboration with other tertiary institutions in Ghana and other parts of Africa. The Vice-Chancellor of the University, Professor Friday Okonofua, FAS (who also doubles as the Centre Leader of CERHI) and the University's Legal Adviser, Mrs. Oludamilola Adejumo represented the University at the Joint Workshop.

PARTNERSHIP WITH THE SHEFFIELD KIDNEY INSTITUTE UNITED KINGDOM

The Kidney Care Centre and Sheffield Kidney Institute, United Kingdom are now an officially recognized as Sister Renal Centres by the International Society of Nephrology (ISN) following a highly competitive application process. This will provide the opportunity for capacity building through exchange programmes between the two Institutions. This will also be of tremendous benefit to the training of the University's medical students.

PARTNERSHIP WITH HOWARD UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL FOR INTERNATIONAL CLINICAL ROTATIONS

The Medical Professionals for Africa was conceived in an effort to foster support amongst medical professionals towards the goal of attenuating the health disparities in African communities around the world. Inaugural meeting was on October 11, 2014 at which time the Medical Students for Africa (MSA) was adopted.

Through the established contacts of Dr. Adegbeniga Kiladejo, an OBGYN from Nigeria currently conducting research in Washington DC, USA, a partnership was created between UNIMED and members of the MSA arm from Howard University School of Medicine (HUCM). One of the goals of the partnership was an International Elective Clinical Rotation at UNIMED affiliated Hospitals in Ondo State, Nigeria from March 24, 2017 - April



19, 2017. During the Clinical Rotation, fourth year HUCM medical students spent four weeks at various primary care, surgery, and OBGYN clinics. The Howard University School of Medicine Team that participated in the Clinical Rotation included two attending physicians; Dr. Oluwafunmilola Bada and Dr. Brandi Jones, and four resident physicians; Dr. Temitayo Gboluaje, Dr. Ikechukwu Amobi, Dr. Crystal Babb and Dr. Ololade Ogundimu.

Specific feedback from the rotating attending and resident physicians states: “UNIMED & Mother and Child are exemplary institutions; despite high patient volumes and relatively scarce resources, high quality care is delivered with very impressive outcomes; consultants provide top quality teaching and training to residents; residents are very knowledgeable, and are being taught in accordance with UK and US guidelines, filtered to be applicable to the clinical settings here in Nigeria and; friendliness of consultants & staff makes a pleasant work environment.”

Based on their rewarding experiences and opportunities to evaluate the needs of the University and Hospital System, the Howard University School of Medicine Team have since pledged to donate an ultrasound machine to the Mother and Child Hospital to help with monitoring and evaluation of fetal development and the assessment of pelvic organs during pregnancy.

The Department of Community Medicine set up a Public Health Laboratory and Public Health Museum. The Laboratory and Museum are well furnished and equipped with the necessary equipment, plates, pots, models, charts

The Department also acquired a bus to convey University Staff and Students for community postings within and outside Ondo City.



CENTER FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ PRACTICE AREAS

To ensure proper coordination of community services, the Department held a stakeholders consultative meeting on the 12th day of June 2017 with the Ondo State PHC Development Agency, and the Hospital Management Board. The objective of the meeting was to select the three practice areas for community health activities. After visitation to some facilities, the following health facilities were selected:

1. Urban: Maroko Comprehensive Health Center in Ondo West LGA
2. Peri-urban: Oke-Igbo Comprehensive Health Center in Oke-Igbo – Ile Oluji LGA
3. Rural: Comprehensive health Center, OkeAgbe in Akoko North West LGA of Ondo State

An MoU is being prepared to be signed among stakeholders when the UNIMED Teaching Hospital is established.

ICT AND OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES

i) Website

The University acquired a new domain name (www.unimed.edu.ng) and hosted a University website. This is a new website managed by the University's ICT Centre. This is a dynamic website populated with relevant contents from the various faculties, departments and units of the University. In addition, regular University events such as Distinguished Guest Lecture, Public Lecture, Founder's Day Lecture were featured on the website. The University Bi-Annual Magazine is regularly uploaded as well as news and events.

ii) Webmail

The University website was hosted under Google for Education platform. Sequel to this, all Staff of the University were provided with the University Webmail address (yourname@unimed.edu.ng).

iii) Students Portal Development

The Students Portal was developed and is fully functional. The portal is currently being used for registration. Software application for the following Student's registration were deployed:

- i) Students Bio-data registration
- ii) Course Registration
- iii) Hostel Accommodation
- iv) Admission Screening Application Software

Based on the University's approved criteria, the screening exercise for 2016/17 admission process was carried out with the use of the application software developed for the purpose by the ICT Centre.



v) Students Examination Results Processing System

The integrated Student's course registration and examination results processing software was developed. It was launched and used for the processing of 2016/2017 results for all Students. In this package, course lecturers and departmental examination officers are able to enter Student's marks and result processing is done respectively.

vi) Health Management Information System

The first phase of this software was deployed for use at the University Health Centre to manage and keep track Student's health records.

vii) e-Payment Facility

An application interphase for bank and web payments were developed for easy nationwide payment to University's designated accounts.

viii) Google Donation of 20 Access Points

20 Access Points were donated to the University donated by Google. This equipment has assisted in connecting several locations to the internet.

ix) NCC Wireless Cloud Project

The University was chosen to benefit from the NCC driven wireless cloud project. The project was deployed at the Odosida campus. Part of this project was the provision of three UPS devices which were used in our server rooms at Laje campus, Odosida Campus and at the University Auditorium.

x) E-Library

The ICT Centre assisted the University Library in the provision of 20 internet based Personal Computers for the use of Staff and Students in the e-Library Centre.

The Visitor to the University, Arakunrin Oluwarotimi Akeredolu, SAN has directed the University to take-over the operations of the Ondo State Schools of Nursing and Midwifery, Akure. This is in consonance with the decision of Nursing and Midwifery Council of Nigeria (NMCN) for nursing diploma awarding schools to merge with existing Departments of Nursing or form mono-technics.

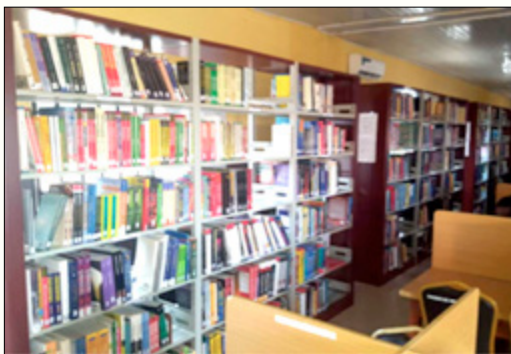
A technical Committee was set up by the State Government to work out the modalities for the take-over. The report on the takeover of the two schools has been sent to Ondo State Government.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The University Library is currently situated at the Odosida Campus of the University. The Library moved to this new location in February 2017. It is bigger in terms of space and more convenient in terms of facilities. There is still need however, to build a permanent and a more befitting University Library. The Library, including the E-Library, has a sitting capacity for one hundred and sixty (160) users.

The total collection of the Library presently stands at over two thousand five hundred (2,500) volumes of books and several titles of reputable local and foreign journals. This is in addition to several books and journals accessed through our e-library using the numerous academic databases and resources.

During the period under review, books, journals and other materials were purchased, processed and made available to our numerous users. 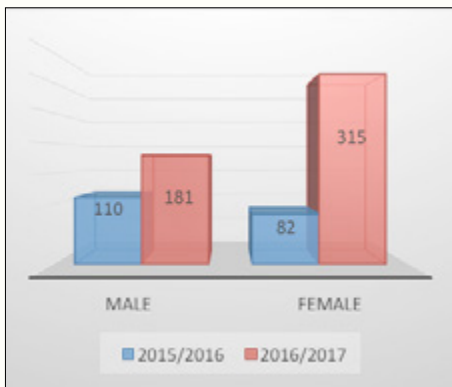

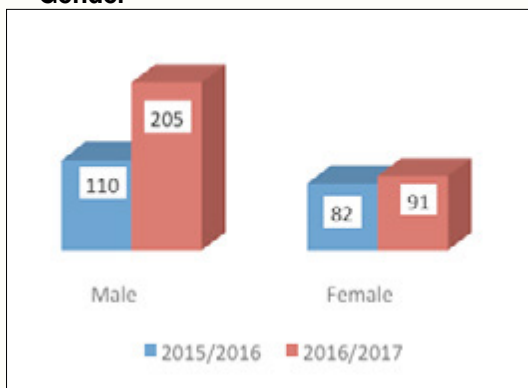

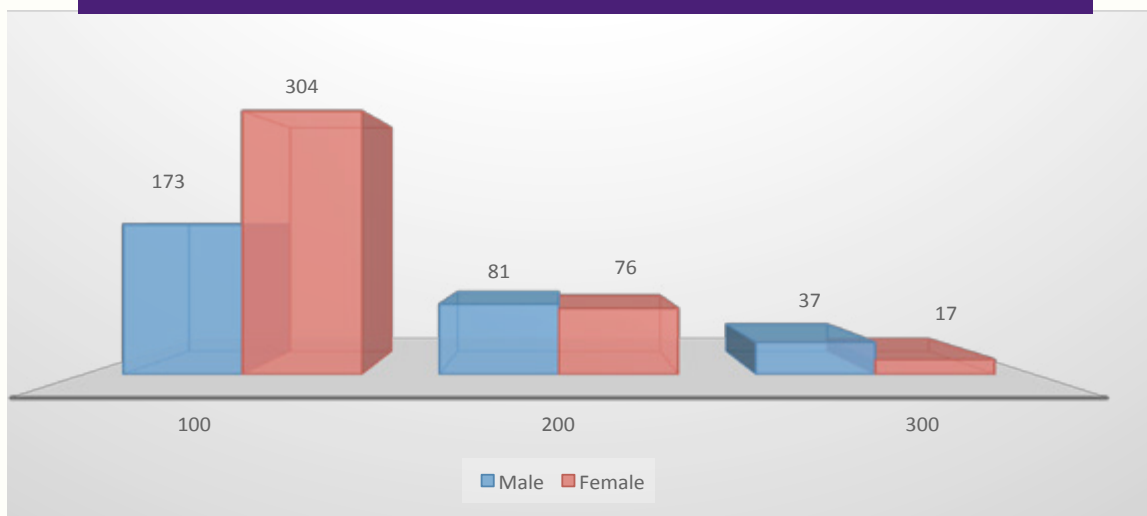

Distribution of Students by Level of Study, 2016/2017 Session

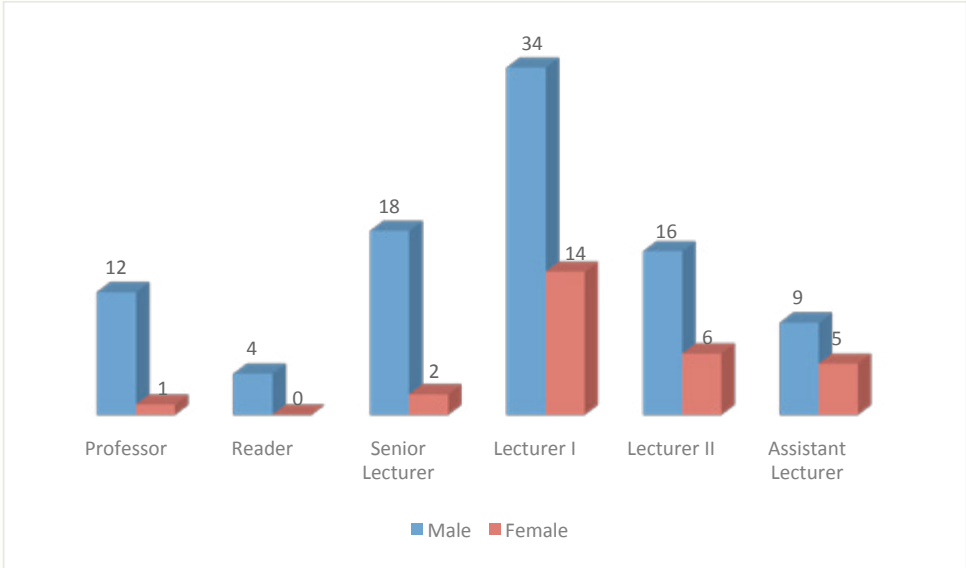




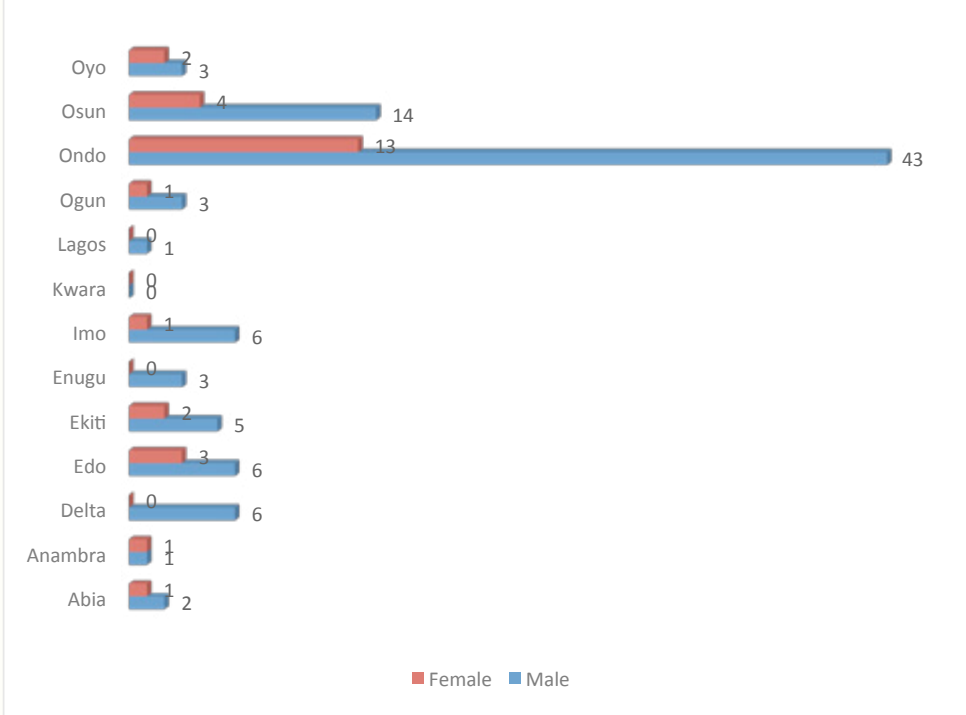

Staff Statistics Distribution of Total Teaching Staff by Status

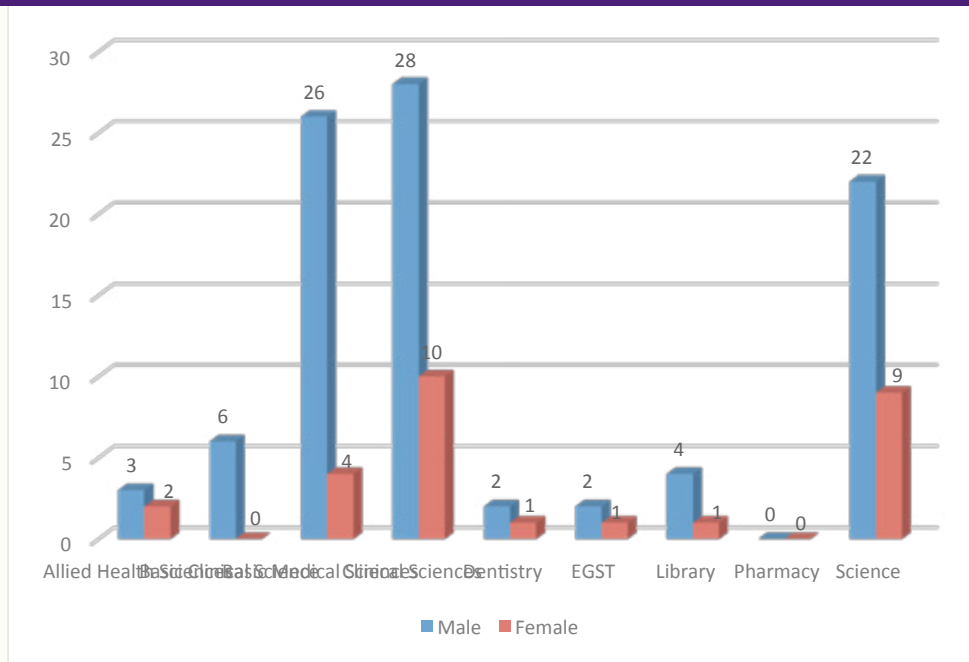


Distribution of Total Teaching Staff by State of Origin

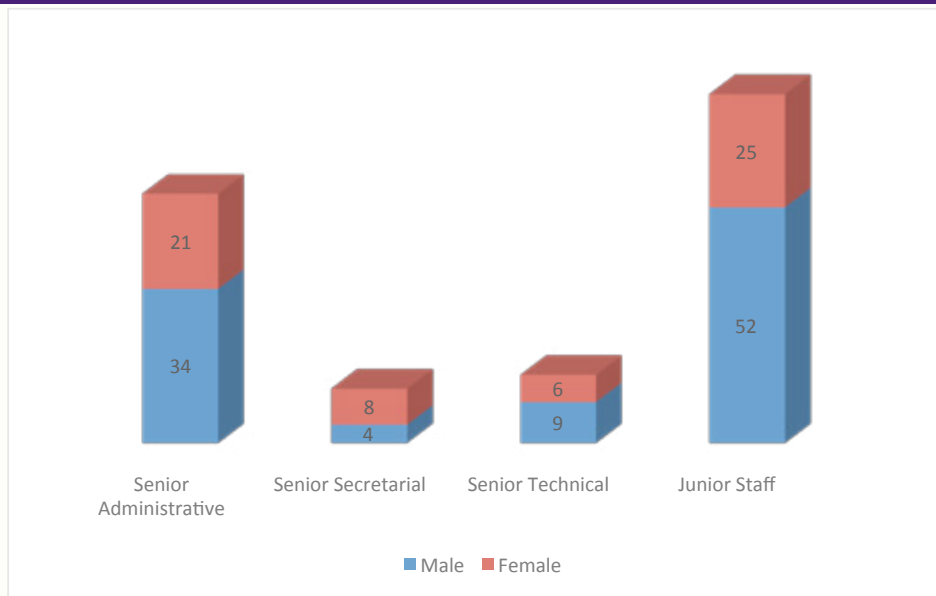




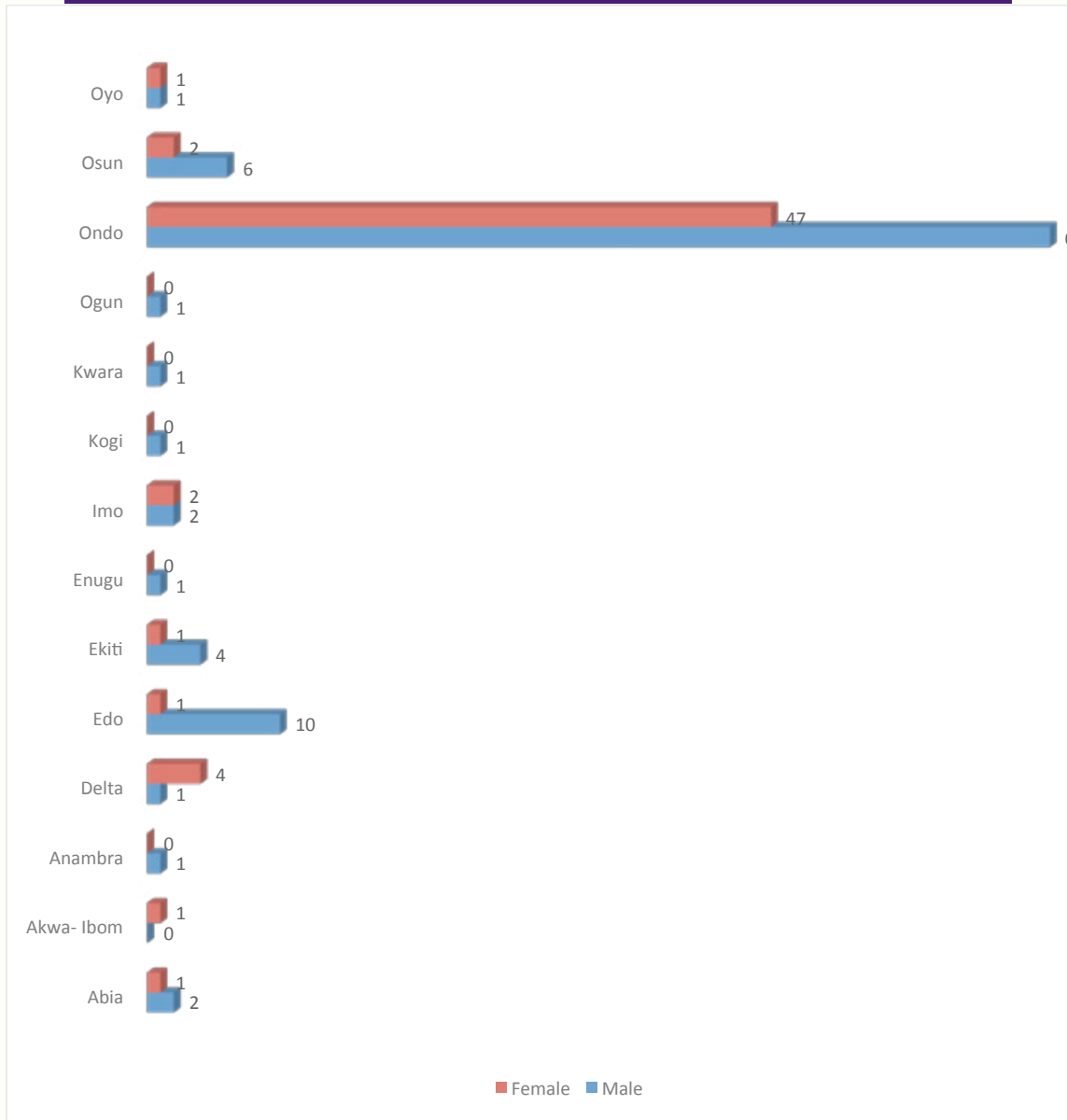
Distribution of Total Teaching Staff by Faculty



Distribution of Total Non-Teaching Staff by Status

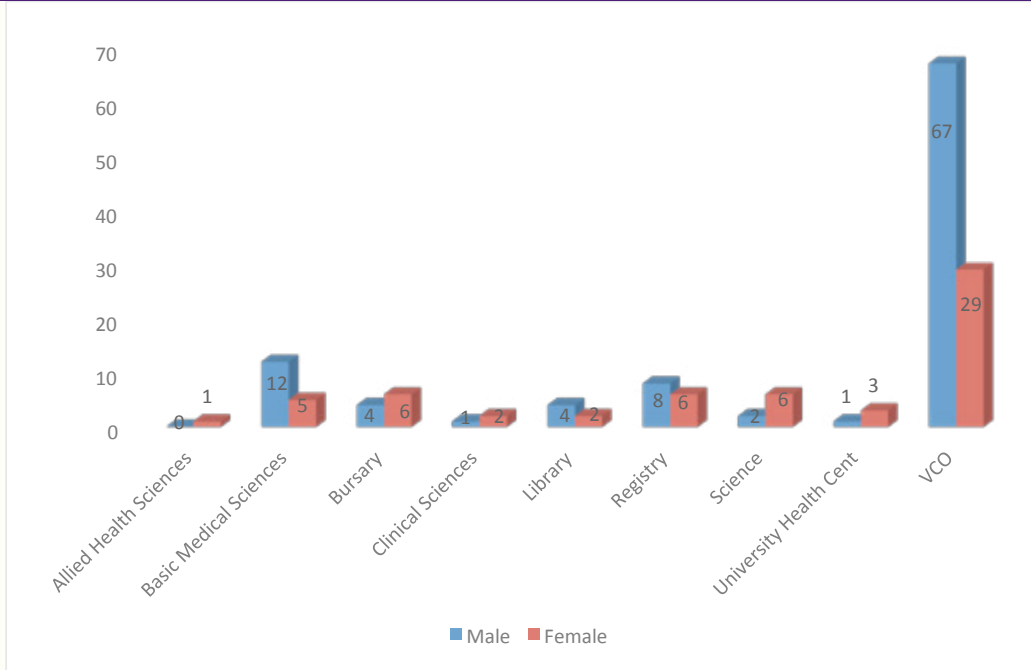


Distribution of Total Non-Teaching Staff by State of Origin

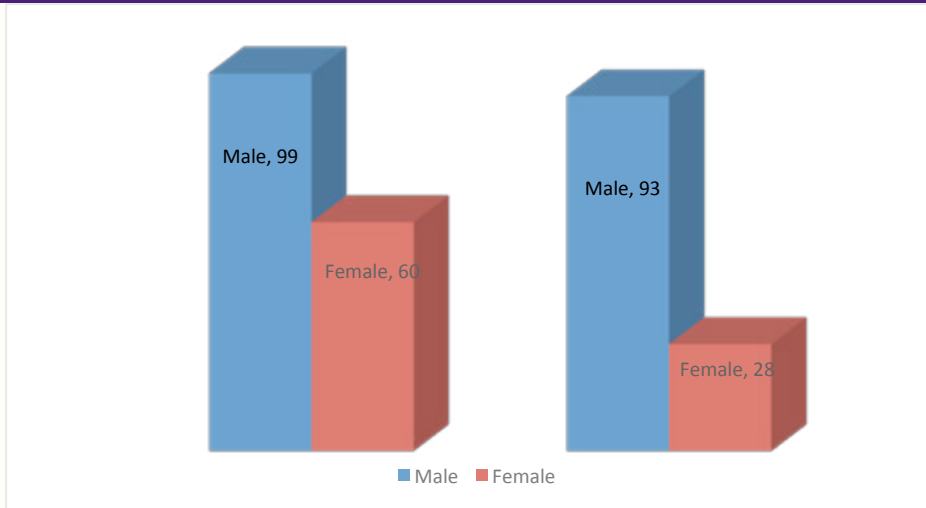




Distribution of Total Non-Teaching Staff by Faculty

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CHIEF (DR.) ISAAC FOLORUNSO AKINTADE (JP)

FAMILY BACKGROUND

Chief (Dr.) Isaac Folorunso Akintade (JP) was born in Ondo City, Ondo State on August 15, 1942 into two prominent families in Ondo Kingdom. His father, late Pa Akintade Fawehinmi, was a direct descendant of the famous and dreaded Lisa Alujannu while his mother, Princess Aderosotu was a daughter of the late Oba Jisomosun Adekolurejo of Ondo Kingdom.

EDUCATION

Chief (Dr.) Akintade started his elementary education at St. Andrew's Primary School Ondo in 1950 and obtained his Elementary School Leaving Certificate in 1957. He later proceeded to the local Authority Modern School in 1959 and graduated in 1961. In his quest for more knowledge, he again attended the Federal Government Teacher's Training College Ilesha, Osun State where he had his Grade II Teachers Certificate before travelling to the United States of America (USA) for further studies.

While in USA, he attended Armstrong High School Washington DC, and went to the Federal City College, now university of the District of Columbia where he bagged is Bachelor's Degree in Economics in 1972. He was later given an American Scholarship to study at the Western Illinois University, Macomb, Illinois, where he obtained his Master's Degree in Quantitative and Analytical Economics with Honors in the year 1974 and had AIB Final Certificate from the American Institute of Banking, Washington D.C in 1976.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Chief (Dr.) Akintade returned to Nigeria in 1976 and started working at the Research Department of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN). He moved to the Federal Ministry of Trade in 1978 to acquire experience in the running of businesses in order to fulfill his lifelong desire of running his own business. While at the Federal Ministry of Commerce, Chief Akintade was in charge of Import License for the whole Federation. He was also the Chairman of the Import Quota Allocation Committee. He finally retired from Government Service in 1983.

Immediately after Chief (Dr.) Akintade's stint at the Central Bank and the Federal Ministry of Commerce, he joined Famak Nigeria Ltd, a company he co-founded, as an Executive Director. He is currently the Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of the company. As a result of his high interest in banking and his desire to assist some of his people who could not get credit facilities from the conventional banks, Chief (Dr.) Akintade also co-founded the Ekimogun Microfinance Bank where he is the current Chairman of the Bank.

CHIEF (DR.) ISAAC AKINTADE AS A POLITICIAN

Having seen great potential in Chief (Dr.) Akintade, the late Oba F. I. Adesanoye, the paramount Ruler of Ondo Kingdom then, invited Chief (Dr.) Akintade to join politics so as to assist Ondo Kingdom achieve its maximum potential in politics. He later invited the former Governor of Ondo State, His Excellency, Dr. Olusegun Mimiko and Chief (Dr.) Akintade into his bedroom where he placed the hands of the Governor into Chief (Dr.) Akintade's hands and blessed them saying that the politics of Ondo State was in their hands.

Chief (Dr.) Akintade became the Leader of Labour Party in Ondo Kingdom and Chairman of Elders' Council of the Party in Ondo State. Chief (Dr.) Akintade is proud to have led Labour Party that broke the jinx and resulted in the installation of the first Ondo Kingdom born Executive Governor of Ondo State in the person of Dr. Olusegun Mimiko.

Chief (Dr.) Akintade served on the Board of Owena Oil and Gas until December 2006 when he resigned to join the Labour Party. Chief (Dr.) Akintade served as a Director of Odua Investment Company until December 2013 and he was also the Chairman of Odua Investment Co. Ltd from December 2013 to April 2017.

Chief (Dr.) Akintade is a member of numerous community and social development organizations as well as a recipient of many awards both local and international.

PHILANTHROPIC ACTIVITIES

In his bid to uplift the wellbeing of so many students in Ondo Kingdom in particular and Nigeria in general, Chief (Dr.) Akintade has awarded without publicity, scholarships to so many indigent students and has assisted in one way or the other, many students travelling overseas for further studies. It is, perhaps, in recognition of this fact that many student bodies have bestowed on him several awards.

CHIEF (DR.) AKINTADE IN TRADITIONAL INSTITUTION

Chief (Dr.) Akintade has bagged many traditional chieftaincy titles in recognition of the enormous roles he has played in the society including the following: Sarowo of Ondo Kingdom, High Chief Aare Atunluse of Ifetedo, Osun State, Bashorun of Iju, Ondo State, Bobajiro of Kurugbene, Igbokoda, Ondo State.

CHIEF (DR.) AKINTADE AS A DEVOUT CHRISTIAN

Chief (Dr.) Isaac Folorunso Akintade is a devout Christian. He is a member of Young Men Christian Association (YMCA) of St. Stephen's Cathedral, Ondo and also a Jerusalem Pilgrim (JP). Chief (Dr.) Akintade is happily married with God loving and highly successful children and grandchildren.

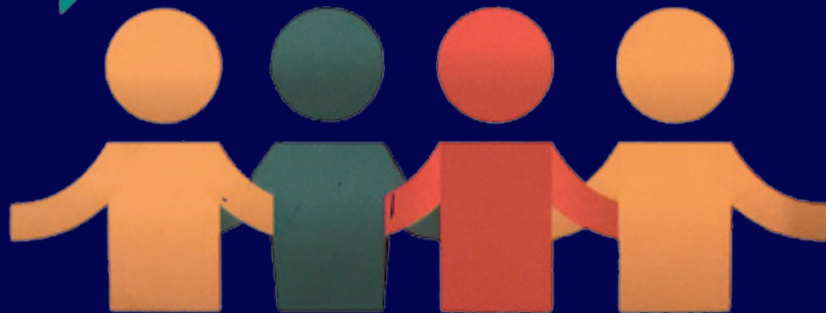


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
